DATE: Friday, October 29

MATCH START TIME: 8:30 AM

LOCATION: Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, located 10 miles NW of Richland, WA. Access to the range is through the main gate on SR 225 (Horn Road) approximately 3 mi south of SR 240 and approximately 8.5 mi north of I-82 in Benton City. Map & GPS coordinates are available on our website.

Facilities at the range are primitive. Lavatories are available (portapotties), but there is no water. Please prepare accordingly.

OPEN TO: Any individual with any safe rifle. Rifles are limited to no more than .35 caliber, so the shot marker disks stay in the holes. Rail guns or "return to battery" rifles are not allowed.

RULES: This is an informal competition. The match program is all prone. The distance is 300, 600, & 800 yards. 600 yard F-Class targets (NRA # MR-1FC) will be used at all ranges.

Ammunition may be any safe commercial manufactured or hand loaded ammunition, and will be provided by the competitor. Tracer, incendiary or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited.

ENTRY FEES: \$10.00 each event. Juniors shoot for free.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented based on the total score.

SCHEDULE:

8:30 AM - Orientation and Safety meeting for all competitors at the registration office. Please be prompt.

9:00 AM - First relay will begin firing.

OTHER DETAILS:

- Competitors will be divided into relays. Competitors will keep their own score, and take turns pulling targets.
- Shooting sequence is as follows:
 - 5 sighter shots at 300 yards and 15 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 20 min.
 - 10 sighter shots at 600 yards and 15 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 25 min.
 - 10 sighter shots at 800 yards and 15 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 30 min.
- The match is the aggregate of the three stages
- Slings or bipods may be used. Bipods must be attached to the rifle. Mechanically adjustable external commercial or homemade front rests are not allowed.
- Rear support bags may be used, but the rifle **MUST** be shoulder fired. Mechanically adjustable rear rests or monopods are not allowed.
- Competitors will be in position prior to commencing fire. Ear & eye protection is required.
- Not all sighter shots need be fired. Sighter shots are not "convertible" for record scoring.
- Disabled competitors are encouraged to attend, and will be accommodated to the best of our ability.
