

Tri-Cities Shooting Association, Inc.
Presents the 2010 Open Any Rifle Prone (OARP) Matches

DATES: 3/5 (start ~ 0830,) 4/16 (start ~ 0830,) 5/14 (start ~ 0800,) 6/25 (start ~ 0730,) 7/9 (start ~ 0730,) 7/24 (start ~ 0730,) 8/6 (start ~ 0730,) 10/15 (start ~ 0830,) and 11/20 (start ~ 0830.)

LOCATION: Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, located 10 miles NW of Richland, WA. Access to the range is through the main gate on SR 225 (Horn Road) approximately 3 mi south of SR 240 and approximately 8.5 mi north of I-82 in Benton City. Facilities at the range are primitive. Lavatories are available (portapotties) but there is no water. Please prepare accordingly.

OPEN TO: Any individual with any safe rifle.

RULES: This is an informal competition. The match program is all prone. The distance is 300 & 600 yards. The targets are the 300 (SR-3) and 600 (MR) yard standard targets. **The smaller F-Class targets may be used depending on availability.** 300 (MR-63FC) and 600 (MR-1FC) yard F-Class targets.

Ammunition may be commercial manufactured or hand loaded safe ammunition and will be provided by the competitor. Tracer, incendiary or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited.

ENTRY FEES: \$10.00 each event. Juniors shoot for free.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented based on the total score.

SCHEDULE

(a) Orientation and Safety meeting for all competitors at the registration office.

Please arrive 30 minutes prior to match start time for instructions and registration.

(b) Competitors will be divided into groups who will take turns pulling targets.

(c) Shooting sequence is as follows:

5 sighter shots at 300 yards and 15 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 25 min.

10 sighter shots at 600 yards and 15 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 30 min.

The match is the aggregate of the two stages

Competitors will be in position prior to commencing fire.

OTHER DETAILS:

- Slings or bipods may be used.
- Bipods must be attached to the rifle. Please no external commercial or homemade rests.
- Rear support bags may be used but the rifle **MUST** be shoulder fired.
- Ear protection is required.
