

**Tri-Cities Shooting Association, Inc. Presents
200 YARD SPORTING and HUNTING RIFLE MATCH
NRA Approved**

DATES: April 3, May 8, June 19, 2010 (First Shots at 8 am; April 3 match times 1 hour later)

LOCATION: Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, located 10 miles NW of Richland, Washington. Access to the range is through the large main gate on SR 225 (Horn Road) approximately 3 miles south of SR 240 and approximately 9 miles north of I-82 in Benton City.

OPEN TO: Any individual

RULES: NRA Sporting Rifle Rules apply. NRA Classifications will be used.

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 for adults; Juniors (under 18 years) shoot for free

REGISTRATION: Entries accepted until 7:45 am. Stats office will open at 7 am for registration.

ARM:

Division 1 A center fire rifle up to .35 caliber, not equipped with palm rest or Schuetzen type buttplate, weighing not over 9.5 pounds including detachable magazine and sights but excluding sling and ammunition. No rifle capable of automatic fire is permitted. Any sighting system may be used. Rifle may not have a muzzle brake or compensator.

Division 2 Any rifle up to .35 caliber without restrictions on weight or compensator. Division 2 will only compete for prizes if there are 5 or more division 2 rifles. Division 2 scores will not be submitted to the NRA.

AMMUNITION: Ammunition may be commercial manufactured or hand loaded safe ammunition and will be provided by the competitor. Tracer, incendiary or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited by local range rules.

TARGETS: 200 yard SR or 300 yd SR-3 (same scoring rings)

SCORING: Competitors will score and will be required to pull targets when in the pits.

SCHEDULE:

7:45 am Orientation and Safety meeting for all competitors

8 am the 32 shot Sporting Rifle Match Course with sighting shots

- 2 SS and 8 shots for record, prone. Time limit: 10 min.
- 8 shots for record, standing. Time limit: 8 min.
- 8 shots for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire. Time limit: 30 sec per 4 shot string.
- 8 shots for record, prone, rapid fire. Time limit: 30 sec per 4 shot string.

The match is the aggregate of the four stages

Rapid fire courses are fired in two 4-shot strings. Competitors will be in position prior to commencing fire.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented based on the number of competitors in each class and by division.

OTHER DETAILS:

- Slings may be used for prone and sitting/kneeling courses.
- Gloves may be worn but must be of a style and construction usual to gloves worn as garments. Specialized shooting gloves are not permitted.
- Coats may be worn, but may not be of a style, construction or type used for competition shooting.
- Ear protection is required.
- Open bolt indicator is required prior to match preparation time and after your firing is complete.
- Facilities at the range are primitive. Lavatories are available (portable) but there is no water. Please prepare accordingly.
- Camping on the range in self contained campers & motor homes is O.K. Note that there is no water or electrical hook ups. Call Paul at (509) 845-4900 for entry instructions. Also, nearby (2 miles north), is a newly refurbished County park on the Yakima River. It has full hook-up and no hook-up sites at moderate cost. No reservation system is in place at this time.
