SPRING FLING FULLBORE MATCH

N.R.A. Approved

DATE: April 17 & 18, 2010. **First Shot Down Range at:** 9 AM Sat., 8:30 AM Sun.

LOCATION: Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, located on SR 225 (Horn Road) approximately 3 miles south of the intersection with SR240 and approximately 3 miles north of Benton City, WA.

OPEN TO Any individual.

RULES: NRA International Fullbore Prone & High Power Rules apply. Any safe rifle/load and any sight up to .35 caliber may fire, but only the .308 Win. cartridge with less than 156g bullet, may used to qualify for awards in Matches 1, 2, 4, & 5. F-Class shooters are welcome.

ENTRY FEE: \$35 across the board both days, \$20 for one day. Junior fees are half price.

REGISTRATION: Entries will be accepted until 8:30 AM Saturday and 8AM Sunday up to a range capacity of 60 competitors. Please pre-register to Bob Gudgel, (509) 783-5111 or (509) 539-8417 (cell).

CLASSIFICATION: NRA Int'l. Fullbore Prone Classification will be used in Matches 1 & 2. NRA Long Range or High Power will be used in Match 3 and for unclassified competitors in all matches. Five or more competitors will make up a class. Any class with fewer than 5 competitors will be combined with the next higher class. If fewer than 5 High Masters enter, they will compete for Match Winner only. There must be at least 5 shooters with non-qualifying rifles to form an F-Class and be eligible for awards.

ARM: Except for Match 3, must meet NRA High Power rule 3.1 or 3.3 OR in Match 3, rule 3.2 to qualify for prizes or NRA classification.

AMMUNITION: Any safe ammunition may be used. In order to maintain range safety, any fired round that fails to reach the target at supersonic velocity may be cause to remove the competitor from the firing line. The use of tracer, incendiary, or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited.

OPEN BOLT indicator is required to be used prior to match preparation time and after your firing is complete.

TARGETS: 300 yd. MR-63, 600 yd. MR, and 800 yd., 900 yd. & 1000 yd. LR targets will be used.

SCORING: Competitors will score and be required to pull targets when in the pits.

COURSE of FIRE:

Saturday 8:45 AM, Orientation and Safety meeting for all competitors. Firing begins at 9 AM

Match 1 - A Fullbore match consisting of:

- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 300 Yds. Time limit: 10 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 600 Yds. Time limit: 10 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 800 Yds. Time limit: 15 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 900 Yds. Time limit: 15 min.

Sunday 8:15 AM, Orientation and Safety meeting for all competitors. Firing begins at 8:30 AM.

Match 2 - A Fullbore match consisting of:

- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 300 Yds. Time limit: 10 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 600 Yds. Time limit: 10 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 800 Yds. Time limit: 15 min.
- 2 convertible sighters and 10 shots for record, prone at 1000 Yds. Time limit: 15 min.

Match 3 - Any Rifle / Any Sight

Unlimited SS and 20 shots for record, prone at 1000 Yds. Time limit: 30 min.

Match 4 - Sunday aggregate of matches 2 and 3.

Grand Aggregate - Total of all fired matches.

AWARDS: Monetary awards will be issued to match winners and others based on the number of competitors in each class.

OTHER DETAILS:

Food - Bring your own WATER and food. No lunch break.

Camping - This is a primitive range. NO WATER or electrical hook ups. Camping in self contained campers & motor homes O.K. Parking is limited to graveled areas. Call for entry instructions.
