TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We held both scheduled **Online Evaluations** in March, with very small class sizes. Because of the small classes we have experienced and



complications trying to get the Class set up, we have decided not to offer the Online Evaluation on April 2.

Our next **Online Evaluation** will be on **May 14**. Registration is not currently open for that session, but should open in the next week or so and will be done on the WDFW website.

We are undecided on offering a **Traditional Class** in June. That class frequently had low student numbers in the past and given the very low student numbers we have seen this year, we are leaning toward not offering that Class.

At this time, students who are age 9 or older can still complete the entire course through the Online Process. Younger students have to complete the field exercise in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and know your zone of fire and stick to it.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public -YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become an RSO, you must be a **current member**, attend the RSO Training Class and obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three to four times a year.

HIGH-POWER

Our Match season is in full swing with **Smallbore Matches** on the 3rd, 5th, 7th, 12th, 14th, 19th, 23rd and 30th; **Service Rifle** on the 9th; **Mid-Range** on the 2nd and 26th; **Long Range** on the 15th and 16th. Please visit the High Power web page at <u>https://www.tcsahighpower.org/</u> to review our full 2022 schedule and associated match programs.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. Be aware that conditions in the Canyon may be different than elsewhere on the Range and avoid soft or muddy areas as best you can.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO. The Rose-Iris Duty Day Calendar is from April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023

Scheduling for the 3 Duty Days for this Calendar Year needs to be done by May 31, 2022.

NO firearms are to be handled during a "**COLD**" range state. This includes cased firearms being taken from the table to a vehicle and from a vehicle to a table. If you have any questions regarding this procedure, please see the Range Safety Officer on Duty.
