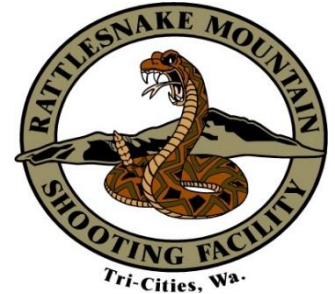

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We held our March 15 evaluation for students who had completed the online portion of the hybrid course, with 18 of 19 students passing the class. Our next evaluation will be on **April 5**.

Following that, we will have Evaluations on **April 26** and **May 10**, with registration opening on **April 7** and **April 21** for those two classes, respectively. Registration will be available on the WDFW website and are shown as “Richland Recreation.” I expect the classes to fill up very quickly, probably within 24 hours. We also anticipate offering these evaluations in August and September.

Our **June Traditional Class** is all set up and will run from **June 16** through **July 3**. Registration will open on May 26, and like our online evaluations, our traditional classes have been filling up quickly.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and make sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

As we had 5 Saturdays in March, we hosted a **6 stage SASS Wild Bunch Match**. Very much like Cowboy action, and using mostly the same rifles and shotguns, but with the single action revolvers replaced by a 1911 .45 semi-auto and a lot of pistol shooting. 10 shooters stuck it out in a surprisingly cold wind. HIGH-POWER

The competition season is in full swing! If you are interested in giving some sort of competition a try, there are plenty of opportunities coming up. Or, if you have a **junior who is interested in giving smallbore** a try, our new **Smallbore Competition Range** will be hosting several Matches throughout the year, with the first one coming up this month.

We kicked off the Across-the-Course season with the annual **Korean War Memorial** service rifle match March 1 - 2. For once we had some nice weather, with a bit of wind challenge as usual. Horseshoe Bend, Idaho's **Rick Cram** (1097-10x) managed to wrest the M1 win away from Spokane's **Dusty McQuary**, who has won the M1 award many times. Dusty was bitten by an M1 gremlin, saving 6 rounds (and 60 possible points) in a rapid string. Dusty has a "not appropriate for publication" saying about the perils

of shooting an M1 across the course, and this match goes to show why. Sequim Washington's **Jay Hennen** took the overall win with an impressive 1247-28x.

For the **600 Yard Mid-Range Match** March 7, a few quick switches of the moderate tail winds required shooters to pay attention to both flags and mirage. **Daniel Maple** (583-19x) edged out **Christian Rhynalds** (579-19x) and **Jeff Menzner** (579-18x). It is rare that X count decides matches at Rattlesnake, but this one wasn't the last in March.

The Long-Range Season kicked off March 8, with **Daniel Maple** taking the top prize in F-Open (806-20x) and **Mike Sowa** taking second overall and F-TR top honors (806-19x), only losing the overall with X count. It is always amazing to have shooters wind up this close in score, especially when dealing with 20 mph shifting winds and completely different equipment and calibers.

On the Smallbore side, we kicked the season off with a **50/100 Yard Dewar Match** March 4. The Dewar Match is the oldest and most celebrated of postal matches, an international smallbore postal competition between 20 person teams from Great Britain, the United States and Australia that began in 1908 as a challenge between the British Society of Miniature Rifle Clubs and the National Rifle Association of America. The Match is named after Sir Thomas Dewar (of Scotch whiskey fame), who donated the trophy, a large silver loving cup standing over two feet tall and exquisitely decorated. Teams of shooters fire 20 shots prone at targets at 50 meters (or as we do a 50-meter target reduced for use at 50 yards) and 100 yards following ISSF rules. Three shooters, **Ben Cook**, **Mike Bunch** and **Phil Keuhlen** shot clean on both targets. Ben was the overall winner with a 400-34x, just edging out Mike (400-34x) on the second tiebreaker. Nice shooting after a long winter layoff!

At the March 9 **100/200 Yard Smallbore Prone Match**, **Ron Jorgensen** took top honors (392-4x) over **John Julian** (390-6x).

Next up was the **USBR 50 Yard Match**, which had nice temps and calm winds. **Ben Cook** took the Match with a 495-22x, followed closely by **Mike Bunch** with a 493-19x, which included a new single card record for Rattlesnake of 249-10x on the second card. Well done!

Rounding out the Match Reports with the March 19 **50 Yard ARA Match**, **Mike Bunch** took top honors with a 3985-24x, while **Brandon Tinker** had the top single card score of 2025-10x.

Looking ahead to **April**, we have got **Centerfire Matches** with a reduced yardage across the course match **April 1**, **Long Range V2 Match April 12** and a **300 Yard Open Any Rifle April 19**. If you are interested in across the course shooting, the April Match is a great one to start with. The reduced yardage (200 yard) for all courses of fire means that any rifle and ammo combo capable of reasonable accuracy and firing 10 rounds in 60 seconds can hold its own. It's a great way to get started and we will be done before noon.

On the Smallbore side of things, we have got a **100/200 Yard Smallbore** (at High-Power) and a **PRS 22 Match** (at HESA) on **April 6**, a **50/100 Yard Dewar** on **April 8**, **Vintage Smallbore April 10**, **200/300 Yard Smallbore Prone April 13**, **50-Yard USBR** on **April 15**, **50-Yard ARA April 17**, **Youth Smallbore April 27** and **100 Yard Mini-Palma April 29**. If you have a junior who is interested in trying out smallbore, **April 12** and/or **April 27** is the time to do it! We will be at the new Smallbore Range and there will be equipment to loan out and members there to help.
