NEXT TWO RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASSES

Our next two TCSA RSO Classes are now scheduled for **Friday September 2** and **Friday October 14**. These Classes will start at 8 a.m. at the Shotgun Range House and last until about 3 p.m. Classes are limited in size to 12 participants each and will be filled on a first confirmed basis.

You will need to be a current 2022-2023 TCSA Member before your name can be added to the RSO Class list. If you are not a current member, either join at the Range or download the TCSA Membership Application form from our website at <u>www.tcsa.info</u>, fill it out and send the Membership Form along with your \$50 Individual OR \$75 Spousal check to the address on the form.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like! To become an RSO, you must be a current member, attend the RSO Training Class and obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three times a year. TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

First, I would like to thank **Cameron O'Byrne**. He is a Boy Scout with Troop 237 and for his Eagle Scout Project he



led a group that built and installed a new sign identifying the Hunter Education Range.

Our next **Online Evaluation** will be on **August 13**. Registration for that Class is currently open on the WDFW website. We are also tentatively planning an **Online Evaluation** for **September 24**, but the details for that Class have not been finalized at this time.

On June 1, 2022 the minimum age for students to complete the entire Online Course without having to attend an in-person range day was raised from 9 to 18 years old. Students younger than 18 will have to complete the range and other requirements in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it were loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never place or carry a loaded firearm in a motor vehicle.

We may be a month later than usual, but the summer heat is here for a little while. Please be prepared when you come out to shoot, stay hydrated and try to enjoy the shade as much as possible on the various fields. The Shotgun Range House has the AC on if you start to feel a little overheated.

If you read through the Rattler last month there was a good article about how the entire TCSA organization, including the Shotgun Range, is run by volunteers, and those volunteers still pay their yearly dues just like everyone else. It got me thinking about all of the volunteers that help out in ways big and small for Shotgun.

One person who does a great job and almost every one of you must deal with is **Chris Quinton**, our RSO Scheduler for the Shotgun side of things. We are lucky Chris has taken on this important task for the past couple of years and performs it so well. Chris does his job in such a way that you forget he is doing it. Meaning everything is handled quickly and efficiently, everyone gets scheduled and for the most part everyone shows up on their duty dates. Everything from pitch, the main ingredient in targets, to the orange paint and the cardboard boxes have gone up. When you add in the increased delivery costs, it is not an insignificant increase to our operating costs. Nothing will be changing in the immediate future, but we are looking at how this will impact costs moving forward.

HIGH-POWER

We are idling away the hot (but relatively calm) days of summer, while still offering the full gamut of Smallbore and High-Power Events throughout the month. There are Smallbore Events on the 2nd, 4th, 9th, 11th, 16th, 20th and 21st; Mid-Range on the 19th and 23rd; Service Rifle on the 27th; and Long Range on the 12th and 13th. Please visit the High-Power page at <u>www.TCSAHighPower.org</u> to review our full 2022 schedule and associated match programs.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

GATE COMBINATION: The Canyon Gate combination has been changed and all High-Power RSOs were notified via email. Contact **John Hauptmann** if you did not receive the email.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately, our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. It is definitely fire season, so behave accordingly.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO. Please contact **John Hauptmann** with questions or to schedule your training.
