## **ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO**

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

## **TCSA FACILITIES**

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

**RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE –** A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

**CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

**COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS** – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

**SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE** - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

**HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE:** This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and store firearms and ammunition separately and locked up.

**TIDBITS:** 5.2.1 Carry and Storage – Except when within the boundaries of a Safety Area or when under the supervision and direct command of a Range Officer, competitors must carry their handguns unloaded in a gun case, gun bag or in a holster securely attached to a belt on their person (see Rule 10.5.1).

5.2.1.2 A competitor who, while not at a Safety Area or under RO supervision, removes their holster or their equipment belt with their handgun still in the holster, shall be considered to be in violation of Rule 5.2.1 and subject to disqualification from the Match. In other words, DO NOT take off your belt with holstered gun at the Port-a-potty or you will be DQd.


# SHOTGUN REPORT

# **HIGH-POWER**

As I write this the National Matches are going on at Camp Perry, Ohio (alas, without me again this year). There is a nice Pacific Northwest flavor to the podium so far. Oregon's James Fox took the cup match, beating out the Army Marksmanship Unit's (and former Washington State Junior) Zevin Linse by just one point across the 3day, 2400-point match. It came down to the last shot and I got to watch it all live on my PC at work, thanks to the CMP's electronic target system being posted up to the minute on their website! We have a similar system at Rattlesnake, and it has finally made high-power a bit of a spectator sport. If you are interested, come out to a match, you can link your phone or tablet right into the system and see the results of each shot in real time. I will also make this offer again like last month: we have got a reduced yardage across the course match on August 23. This is a great opportunity if you want to try out High-Power, just about any repeater centerfire that can hold 5 or more rounds can be made to work. If you want to try it out and can come up with 88 rounds of .223 factory ammo, get in touch with me at the email below and I will set you up with my backup rifle so you can try it out.

Schedule wise for August, besides the aforementioned reduced yardage match, we have got a smallbore heavy month. We have got the usual 50/100 Yard Dewar on the 5th, Vintage Smallbore on the 7th, 100/220 Yard Smallbore on the 9th, 50 Yard USBR Smallbore on the 12th, 50 Yard ARA Small-bore on the 14th, 200/300 Yard Smallbore on the 16th, and 100 Yard Mini-Palma on the 26th. For the youths out there, we have got Smallbore Youth Matches at the new Smallbore Range on the 9th and the 24th.

Looking back at July, the July 8 **Dewar Match**, we started off with a perfect dead quiet day for shooting but when we came out of the safety briefing, we found the wind had started kicking up with gusts up to 16 mph and swirling winds. **Glen Clifford** overcame the wind and shot a very nice 399-20x for the Match win and high card. We welcomed back **John Schneider** to our shooting Match, and he shot a 396-22x for 3rd place with all the rust, great shooting John!
