PRESIDENT'S REPORT



TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE - A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS - Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE - A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it were loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never place or carry a loaded firearm in a motor vehicle.

Be sure they understand that until they get their membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the daily range fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

HIGH-POWER

Scheduled Events have concluded for the year, but the High-Power Range remains open for use by any RSO's who have a High-Power Endorsement. If you are interested in obtaining the High-Power Endorsement, contact **John Hauptmann** (contact information below) to schedule.

Our High-Power 2023 Calendar will be posted any day now at https://www.tcsahighpower.org/. You will also find match descriptions and other match information there. For calendar year 2023 most Centerfire Matches will be fired on electronic targets, which means no pit duty required! Exceptions will be the 500 and 800 Yard Open Any Rifle Matches (which are quick enough that the e targets do not save any time) and of course all Small-Bore Matches (subsonic bullets will not work with e targets). If you have a tablet or a phone that can connect to wifi you can use it as your scoring device and can collect screen grabs of your targets. The RSO at the Match can show you how. This system can also make Matches into a bit of a spectator sport since observers can see the same target impact information the shooters can see.



We shoot a lot of varying disciplines at the High-Power Range, so we have decided to use up a bit of Newsletter space each month describing one of the disciplines a bit. We will feature a different discipline each month, so be sure to check us out in the coming months.

This month we will describe **Conventional High-Power**. Conventional High-Power has its roots in late 19th Century Military Competition. The current form is any centerfire rifle under 35 caliber fired from 3 positions in 4 stages: 200 yard standing slow fire, 200 yard sitting rapid fire, 300 yard prone rapid fire and 600 yard prone slow fire. Rifles can either be a service rifle (M-1 Garand, M-14 variant or M-16 variant) or a match rifle (anything else). Iron sights or scopes up to 4.5 power are allowed on service rifles and irons sights or unlimited scopes are allowed on match rifles.

We shoot this discipline about once per month through the shooting season, with a few minor variations. Most common is the **Regional Match Course** (RMC), which is 20 shots in each stage. There is also the **Civilian Marksmanship Program's Excellence in Competition** (EIC) Matches, which are 10 shots on the short line stages and 20 from slow prone. This match can earn shooters points towards the distinguished rifleman


