

TCSA GRANT STATUS

TCSA applied to the Recreation Conservation Office for a Grant to assist with development of a new 105-Meter Small Bore Range and to pave the Rose-Iris Parking lot. After much work by members of the TCSA, staff from Benton County Parks Department and the Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Grant has been approved.

The new Smallbore Range will be developed in the spring of 2024 and should be in place by sometime in May or early June. Since this Range will only be used for Smallbore Matches, we will be able to schedule Matches on weekends as well as the rest of the week. Scheduling on weekends should allow participation by more shooters.

The paving of the Rose-Iris Parking lot should take place in May or June also. The paving of the parking area has long been desired and will reduce dust and make for easier parking.

CALENDAR WEBSITE UPDATES

Now that we are approaching the end of 2023 it is time to update our websites. Updates for the Master TCSA website are well underway and will be completed in the next couple weeks. You can view the changes currently in place by going to <u>www.tcsa.info</u> and selecting the Calendar option. Once the Calendar comes up scroll the month option and it will take you into 2024.

Along with updates to the TCSA Master Calendar, the High-Power Match Calendar is also being updated along with all the Match Descriptions. It is anticipated that the High-Power updates will be implemented and available on the www.highpower.org website in early December.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and

the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never place or carry a loaded firearm in or on a motor vehicle.

These Fun Shoots are a great time to come out, meet other shooters and just enjoy a day of shooting clay targets.

When is the next one? I'm glad you asked! We will be having our **Annual Christmas Shoot** on **December 17**. Shooting starts at 9:00 am-ish and will go until we are all tired of

shooting. Lunch will be included once again, so come out and join in the fun!

In between all of the Holiday Shoots we are still holding 50 Bird Handicap Trap Shoots on each and every Sunday. We have been having 3 to 4 squads of shooters each weekend and with the handicap system working its magic we have been seeing a wide variety of winners each week. While John Wilgus started out strong, he was guickly moved back to the 24-yard line which opened the door for other shooters. Mike Tomlinson, Don Klages, Don Lint and John Dyes have all been winners and gained at least 2 yards. New shooters all start at the 20-yard line, which puts you at a pretty big advantage just for joining the fun. Every Sunday we start signup at about 8:30 a.m. with shooting starting at 9:00 a.m. 2 rounds of trap goes pretty quickly, so if you have to work on Sundays like Cole Skiba, there's plenty of time to do both.

With the inevitable winter weather rolling in please be careful on the sidewalks and the trap and skeet fields as they can be icy in the morning. There is ice melt in the backroom of the Range House that can be used on any slick spots. Also be careful on the steps down into the trap houses and the ramp into the high-house on the skeet field.

As a reminder, if you take a TCSA Membership application, whether it is a renewal or a new member, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the Daily Range Fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

"Hero Volunteer of the Month" came out of left field this month. After months and months of having a "volunteer to do" list on the white board **Greg Genoni** took on several of the tasks all by himself! While also being a good RSO, Greg decided to take care of trimming the bushes around the Trap Fields and removing the dead tree. HIGH-POWER

The competition season has wrapped up for 2023. The High-Power Range remains open for RSOs with a High-Power Endorsement. Remember to sign in and pay your day use fee at the connex in the pits.

Planning for the 2024 season is underway, and the **2024 Calendar** will be out soon, along with updated Match descriptions as needed. A couple of upcoming changes of note:

- Our spring NRA approved across the course and CMP EIC Match weekend will move from May to June. This should give us better weather and moving it away from Mother's Day weekend will hopefully increase attendance.
- Several of our across the course matches through the year will be shot at reduced yardage. Not having to move yard lines speeds the match up considerably, especially when combined with the e-targets. Reduced yardage also means no need for more specialized ammo to shoot full yardage, which will reduce cost as well.
- Our April across the course match will be a CMP reduced yardage league match. This gives shooters an opportunity to shoot for record against competitors from across the country.

Our results rundown for November starts with a **50–100-Yard Dewar Match** on November 7. From the Match Director: "This morning sure reinforced some old sayings, such as 'misery loves company.' I was sure glad to not be suffering all alone in the coolish temperatures and ghoulish winds." **Gary Meerdink** managed first place with a 396-26x, beating **David Vance** by just one point (395-21x).

The November 11 Vintage Smallbore Match had brisk temperatures again, but the wind was much more cooperative. Gary Meedink and David Vance cleaned BOTH cards but moved down the finishing order due to their handicaps for optical sights. Mike Bunch cleaned up with honors for both the high card and the match win, along the way setting a new ALL TIME Record for the high Vintage Smallbore Match score (399-30x). Well done!

The November 14 **Smallbore Benchrest Match** was again cold (it is November after all) but wind conditions were again good so scores, although not perfect, were high overall. **Phil Keuhlen** was overall winner (486-12x), plus high card and high x count. **Ben Cook** was a close second with 481-6x.

Rounding out the competition year was the November 16 **50 Yard ARA Match**. Seven shooters braved the frigid temperatures and the early fog lifted by the start of the Match. Although the light winds held out the promise of good scores, only **Ben Cook** and **Gary Meerdink** could capitalize on them to crack the 4000 aggregate score mark. I am blaming it on the temperature for the rest of us! **Ben Cook** cleaned up on the honors, continuing his impressive late season run. Ben won both the Match (4475-27X) and high card (2325-17X) awards and ran away from the field with 27X's. Congratulations!
