This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

We have decided to schedule for the next RSO Class for **Friday**, **February 17**. This Class will start at 8 a.m. at the Shotgun Range House and last until about 3 p.m.

Because all annual Memberships expire on March 31<sup>st</sup> each year, we are requiring each class participant to renew their annual membership through the 2023 to 2024 membership period. Renewals or New Memberships must be received 2 weeks before the Class. This will ensure that each RSO will be able complete their required 3 duty days per year. Renewing or joining the TCSA now will allow you to attend this Class.

If you can make the **Friday**, **February 17** class date, and have your TCSA membership current through the 2023 – 2024 time period, contact **Dan Martini** at <u>dantini@charter.net</u> with your name and membership number and I will add your name to this RSO Class list. I will also send you a reminder message a week before that Class with all the details.

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete the Friday Class and volunteer to stand 3 duty days each year on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range. You pick which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range.

ALL MEMBERS MUST show a current Membership Card to the RSO on duty upon arrival at the Range. Membership Cards need to be shown at all Ranges and



all Events or you will be required to pay the non-member Range Use Fee. <u>EVERYONE must sign-in!</u>

It is nice to see the Duty Calendar starting to fill in with RSOs that have renewed early. The earlier you renew the more selection you have when you sign up.



Fingers crossed Februarys' weather is mellow this year, but we shall see. January was a pretty decent month for shooting. The weather was mostly agreeable, or at least tolerable and we had pretty consistent token counts each week. Hopefully we see more of the same for the coming weeks. The Shotgun Board saw some changes to start off the new year. **Skeet League 2023** will begin on **May 6** and end on **May 27**. As usual League will consist of 10 rounds of Skeet, cold gun and you can only score your rounds on Saturdays. Look for the flier in the Range House in the next couple of weeks.

If the winter weather rolls in again please be careful on the sidewalks and the trap and skeet fields as they can be icy in the morning. There is ice melt in the backroom of the Range House that can be used on any slick spots. Also be careful on the steps down into the trap houses and the ramp into the high-house on the skeet field.

With membership renewal season upon us, please remember if you take a TCSA Membership application, and they are a new member, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their new membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the Daily Range Fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

## **HIGH-POWER**

Our schedule is up for the 2023 calendar year at <a href="https://www.tcsahighpower.org/">https://www.tcsahighpower.org/</a> There are no events scheduled for the month of February, but March will kick off our competition schedule with just about every weekend day having an event through October. In the meantime, the High-Power Range remains open for RSO's with a High-Power Endorsement. Other than a couple weeks so far, we have had a pretty mild winter, but be aware of weather conditions before you head to the Range. If there is snow in town, the roads at the range are likely to be covered in drifts. If the roads are impassible consider the range closed until conditions improve. Damage to the roads is expensive to fix!

If you are interested in trying out some competition at other ranges in the state, the state competition schedule is available at the State Rifle and Pistol Association website <a href="https://wsrpa.org/">https://wsrpa.org/</a>. While you are there be sure to join the association, a big part of your membership helps send the state junior team to Camp Perry each year!

We shoot a lot of varying disciplines at the High-Power Range, so we have decided to use up a bit of Newsletter space each month describing one of the disciplines a bit. We will feature a different discipline each month. This month it is Smallbore/Rimfire's turn. A quick glance at the schedule will show that we have 8 different Rimfire Match styles scheduled for the year. We do not have the space here in the Newsletter to do them all justice (plus I have only shot about 4 of them), so we will let you look them up on the website to find the one that's best for you and instead we'll take a grander approach to describing Smallbore/Rimfire in general.

Most of our Smallbore and Rimfire Matches are not registered or approved events, but instead just a local match. This gives us the opportunity to have a Match that is quite laid back and allows us to make sure that anyone who shows up will get a chance to compete no matter what equipment they have. You will find that at most of the Matches that are set up for prone shooting, most competitors will shoot an F-class style set up with a scoped rifle and bipod. So do not let a match name like "Mini-Palma" scare you into thinking you need an Anschutz with target iron sights and a sling, bring that scoped Savage with a bipod and have some fun!

One of the biggest factors in rimfire accuracy is the ammo. Most off the shelf ammo does not perform all that well at 100 yards or more because the bullet is falling through the trans-sonic barrier at that range. Even the high velocity rounds that carry hypersonic speeds past 100 yards do not perform too well due to the pressures needed at the chamber to create that velocity. You will find instead that most competitors shoot subsonic match

ammo. Manufacturers like Lapua, Eley, Wolf, SK and Aguila all sell various subsonic match ammo and you can find them online at places like Midway for decent prices (relatively speaking). Before going whole hog buying cases of ammo, you should try it out in **your** rifle. 22 rimfire rifles are notoriously picky about ammo and what groups great in one rifle will look like a shotgun blast pattern in another.

To equal the playing field in that regard, this year we have introduced a new 100 yard Mini-Palma Match where competitors **must** fire the ammo provided as part of your entry fee. This is expected to be a fun match and a great way to get started in mini-palma competition. There are 6 of these matches scheduled this year in April, June, July, August, September and October. Check the website for a full description.

# HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We are in the middle of our **January Traditional Hunter Ed Class.** We have a full roster for the Class, which is exciting for us after having low numbers of students last year.



Registration is also open for Online Student Evaluations for March 4, March 18, April 1 and May 15 for students who have completed the Online Course. These classes take most of the day. We start at the HESA Range in the morning, then move in to the Richland Community Center in the afternoon.

We anticipate offering another **Traditional Class** in **June** and **Online Evaluations** in **August** and **September**. I will announce those Classes in future articles when the details are finalized. Information on our Classes and all other Hunter Ed Classes is also available on the WDFW website.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never point a firearm at anything you don't want to shoot.

#### TEN RULES OF SAFE GUN HANDLING

- 1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- 2. Firearms should be unloaded when not in use
- 3. Do not rely on your gun's "safety"
- 4. Be sure of your target and what's beyond
- 5. Use correct ammunition
- If your gun fails to fire when the trigger is pulled, handle with care
- Always wear eye and hearing protection when shooting
- 8. Be sure the barrel is clear of obstructions before shooting
- 9. Do not alter or modify your gun and have your guns serviced regularly
- 10. Learn the mechanical and handling characteristics of the firearm you are using
