TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE - A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

We are in the middle of our January Traditional Hunter Ed Class. We had a full roster of 20 students registered for the class.



We will hold evaluations for students who have completed the Online Course on March 16. April 6 and May 11. Those Classes are all set up on the WDFW website and registration for each will open about a month before the class date. Our classes and those offered by other instructor teams are all listed on the WDFW website.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.

Opportunities for Youth Shooting Sports Teams and Clubs

The **Civilian Marksmanship Program** has announced that up to \$335,000 will be awarded in scholarships to fund accredited secondary education, technical / trade school or vocational programs in 2024.

The CMP seeks applications from high school seniors who will graduate in 2024 and who currently compete in marksmanship competitions. Based on merit, selected individuals are high school seniors who are currently enrolled in a team or club that is participating in marksmanship competitions. SOME OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH PARTICIPATION IN MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITONS INCLUDE:

The American Legion Junior Three-Position Air Rifle Tournament -- These are postal matches for teams affiliated with an American Legion Post.

CMP Aces Postal -- This satellite match offers all junior and adult air rifle and air pistol shooters a program designed to encourage participation in the sport and test marksmanship skills nationally with their peers. The program consists of Air Rifle, Air Pistol and Para-Air Rifle/Air Pistol events.

Junior ROTC Postal Competition -- The JROTC Three Position Air Rifle Postal Competition is one of the most participated shooting competitions in the United States. Each year, thousands of JROTC Cadets, representing Army, Marine Corps, Navy and Air Force JROTCs compete in the Postal Competition.

TRI-CITIES SHOOTING ASSOCIATION MATCHES --

We currently have some degree of participation by young (18 years old or less) shooters who go head-to-head with older shooters in our organized rimfire and centerfire matches. We could serve our membership and our community by incorporating a Youth Shooting Sports Club under the umbrella of TCSA and sponsoring competitive events for youth affiliated with existing groups.

The 2024 High-Power Calendar is up on our website. link below. This month, much like January, is pretty quiet. We have got a 1000-yard 1MOA Steel Match on February 11, and a PR 22 Match on the 18th. The rest of the month is free for RSO's with a High-Power Endorsement to use the Range. Don't forget to sign in at the pit conex and pay your day use fee. Things get very busy in March so don't waste the opportunity while it's here!

I'll start early for the March calendar, the across the course season starts with the Korean War Memorial Service Rifle Match March 9 - 10. It is open to any service rifle (or you can shoot out of competition with a match rifle), but there's a special prize for the top M-1 Garand, a Korean War commemorative proof silver coin. So, dig that "greatest battle implement ever devised" out of the back of the safe, load up some '06 ammo and don't forget your en bloc clips!

You may have heard we're about to start construction on a Smallbore Range, it will be down nearer to the main gate, hopefully with a little less wind than up on the top of the hill. Construction will take some time, but once it's done, we will be moving most/all the smallbore stuff to that Range. SHOTGUN REPORT

Old Man Winter decided to rear his ugly head during the past month with some chilly temperatures and the dreaded snow fall. Not surprisingly, round counts and range visits were about as low as the temperature for January.

Speaking of round counts and range visits, the end of year numbers are in for 2023. Luckily, we were up across the board for the year. Depending on the metric you like to look at, the degree of "up" varies. In 2023 we threw 323,444 targets, up over 65,000 targets from last year. Of course, that means we collected an additional 2429 tokens over last year for a total of 12,264 tokens in 2023. Range visits were up slightly by 224 visits to 4360 for 2023 as well. We did have one metric that was down for the year, but even it was a good metric to be down on. Our "loss" for 2023 was right at 13,000 targets, and while that is a lot of targets, it equates to a loss of 4.2%, or right at 1 target per round. Compared to our loss of 5.1% in 2022, 4.2% is looking pretty good.

Just because I like "numbers" and I also like tracking those numbers, here are some more for you. In terms of targets, we loaded **38 pallets of targets** into the trap, skeet and 5-stand machines in 2023. That also equates to **2,394 cases** of targets. If that sounds like a lot of work, well, it was. A truck load of targets equates to **23 pallets** in a 53' trailer. While the **4% loss** mentioned above seems like a small number it equates to **1.5 pallets**, or **96 cases** of targets. All in all, the numbers were good and it would be nice to keep them going for 2024.

There is a lot of work that goes into those numbers, and a lot of people volunteer their time to make it all possible. Loading targets into the various houses mainly fell on **Lindsay Nelsen**, **John Dyes** and **myself** with an honorable mention for **Tom Walchuk** and others I am sure I am forgetting. Loading all of the targets into the machines is handled by our wonderful RSO's that volunteer their time each and every day the Range is open.

The Range has had a couple of machines down during the past month, but luckily those issues have been fixed. Thanks to **Tom Walchuk, Eric Bickel** and **John Dyes** for helping on getting Skeet Field 1 and Trap Field 2 up and running once again.

While we are on the subject of thanking people, I'd also like to thank **Chris Quinton** for handling the duties of RSO's Scheduling for another year. And while Chris does the scheduling, **Stu Bruce** handles all of the training for new RSO's that come to Shotgun. Stu holds down the title of Secretary for the Shotgun Board as well. **Wild Bill Cooney** is our usual RSO for Wednesday mornings while **Don Knowlton** handles most Wednesday afternoons during the year. Of course,

there is Ron Geiger who takes meticulous care of Skeet field #2. The dynamic trio of Ron, Tom Walchuk and John Dyes did a wonderful job of cleaning and mowing the fields right before the freezing weather hit. Lindsay Nelsen handles the duties of Treasurer for the Shotgun Range in addition to being in charge of loading targets. John Wilgus is usually the driving force behind most of the shoots and impromptu bbg's we hold at the Range. Don Klages brought us the successful Pump Gun & Side by Side shoot this past year. As you have read about in the past couple of Shotgun Reports, Chad Ungerecht and wife Paulyn do a great job with the Turkey and Christmas shoots each year. Gottschalk and John Dyes took care of mowing the fields last year. Dave Otto and Gabe Hall shared the duty of edging all of the sidewalks during the summer. Also, a big thank you to John Dyes and everyone who helped shovel snow and throw out ice melt during the winter weather. A huge THANK YOU to Phil Volkman for donating the sweet Snow Blower to the Range a couple of years ago. It was a God send for clearing the 2-foot snow drifts on the Skeet Range and in front of the trap houses. I'm sure I have forgotten some people who deserve to be mentioned and for that I apologize in advance. We have a lot of people who volunteer, and we can always use more help. Thank you to all of our Range Officers for opening the Range in good and bad weather. Together we have one of the nicest Shotgun Ranges in the PNW.
