Happy 2022! With the start of a new year comes the start of what I call "Renewal Season." We currently have just over 2,600 members! To the members who have already sent in their renewals for this coming year, - thank you!

### **TCSA FACILITIES**

**ROSE-IRIS RANGE** – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

**RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE –** A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

**CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

**COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS** – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

**1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE** – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

**HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE:** This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

### HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We are making some progress with organizing a January Traditional Hunter Education Class. We have room space



reserved, but still have details to work out on how students will register for the Class. The Class will be held from **January 24** through **February 10** on Monday and Thursday evenings from 5:30 – 8:30 p.m. There will also be a required Range Day on **Saturday February 5**. If you are interested in taking the Class, send me an email and when details get finalized, I will let you know.

Students who are age 9 or older can complete the entire course through the Online Process. Younger students still have to complete the field exercise in person. We are also planning to offer the one day in person evaluation for students who have completed the Online Course starting in March and are hoping to do four evaluations in the March – May timeframe.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up after you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and unload firearms when they are not in use.

I still have the two-way radio and timer that were left at the HESA Range several months ago. If they are yours, contact me, identify and we will figure out how to get them back to you.

Yes, we have winter weather coming in full force this final week of 2021, but the machines are still loaded and running and the token machine is waiting for your \$5, \$10 or \$20 bills! Get all dressed up in your winter clothing and come on out to shoot! You will probably regret it halfway through your round, but it is all for a good cause.

**Chad Ungerecht** worked his magic once again for the **Christmas Fun & Games Shoot** held on December 19. Plenty of hams were won by the Shooters who were present as well as some gift cards if you were lucky enough to break one of the many special-colored birds used for the event. If you are feeling like you missed a fun time and are feeling less than good about yourself there is another chance to join in on the fun. The **Winter Fun & Games Shoot** is going to be held on **January 23!** That's right, the first shoot of the New Year for the Shotgun Range is just around the corner. Be there or be square!

One of the year-end tasks that we just completed is the tabulation of total visits to the Shotgun Range for 2021. We had 209 visitors from out of state, 438 visitors from outside the Tri-City area and 4089 local visitors for a total of 4736 visitors to the Shotgun Range for 2021! Considering the challenge of finding ammo throughout the year, that is a pretty good number.

How do we track these numbers you ask? That would be one of the reasons we are all asked to sign-in each and every time we visit the Shotgun Range. The first part of the sign-in sheet is your name of course and then there is your signature followed by the date you visited the Range. Most everyone is pretty clear on all of that. The next (3) little boxes are for visitors to indicate if they are "Local", "Out of Area" or "Out of State" and this is where there is some confusion, with a little bit of the Lemming Disease mixed in for good measure. The visitor should select which box fits them best. If they traveled all the way from Kennewick, they should still select "Local". If, by chance they are named Gene Curcio, and they live in some place called Touchet, Washington, then they would be considered "Out of Area", and last but not least when Mr. Don Witte travels from his comfy home in Pendleton, Oregon he should select "Out of State". Easy-peasy, lemon squeezy!

I have the distinct honor of reviewing and tabulating each and every sign-in sheet for the year and while it is undoubtably a glamorous job, it can also be a little tedious. Most times it is as simple as adding up all the

different type of visitors we have each day and putting the information into a spreadsheet that does all of the heavy lifting. There are times though when I notice something that seems a little odd. The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will remain in place for the 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- If you have been vaccinated you don't need to wear a mask outdoors on the High-Power Range; no verification of vaccination is required.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

**RANGE CONDITIONS:** The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense as we move into the winter season. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. Be aware that conditions in the Canyon may different than elsewhere on the Range. Avoid soft or muddy areas during wet conditions.



**HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT:** For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It only takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO.
