## **TCSA FACILITIES**

ROSE-IRIS RANGE - A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE - A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS - Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE - A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Ready or not the New Year is upon us! Unfortunately, the end of 2022 brought cold temperatures, and more snow than we've had during December in several years. Hopefully Mother Nature is going to get this winter weather out of her system and we can move onto an early spring.

It may have been cold and slightly foggy, but the **2022 Christmas Shoot** went off swimmingly! Once again **Chad Ungerecht** was the ringleader for our little circus of trap shooters. We had 45 participants show up on December 18 from a wide range of areas around the Columbia Basin. With the (2) trap fields running most of

the morning and shooters doing what shooters do, we gave away all 240 lbs. of the bacon from Hills Meats. You can never go wrong with bacon as a prize.



Trap 1, better known as the "amateur" trap was once again under the watchful eyes of **Mike Peale** and **Lyle Laughery**. With shooter experience ranging from "first time ever" to "sandbagger extraordinaire" Mike and Lyle do a very good job of keeping the games going and fun for everyone. By the sheer number of empty shells on the ground I'd say everyone had a good time up there.

**Chad**, **Steve Williams** and others ran Trap 2, more commonly known as the "professional" trap. I only refer to it as the professional trap because the shooters who shoot these "meat" shoots on a regular basis are very good at shooting from distances that outpace my abilities. Either way, it is still a good time being on the line with everyone and you should come out and give it a try.

There is a lot of hard work that goes into any shoot that is put on at Rattlesnake. The heavy lifting for the Turkey and Christmas Shoots is taken care of by **Chad Ungerecht** and his wife **Paulyn**. Chad does a good job of getting the word out to everyone, visiting **Sportsman's Warehouse** and **Ranch and Home** for giveaways and sourcing and picking up the meat of choice for the particular shoot. While Chad does all of that, Paulyn does the important work of feeding everyone and let me tell you, she is a great cook. **Thanks to you both for all of your hard work each year!** 

With 2022 coming to an end, it is always interesting to see how the numbers for the year panned out. The Shotgun Range saw 4,100 visitors with 500 of those visitors coming from outside of the Tri-City area. We threw approximately 240,000 targets across (2) trap fields, (1) skeet field and a very well run 5-Stand field. We have the lowest shooting cost of any other Shotgun Facility in our general area and we are in a strong position moving into the new year. Speaking of the New Year, we are working on putting on a couple more shoots in 2023. Details are still fluid at this point, but we are looking at putting on a *Trap Shoot*, a *Skeet Shoot* and I am sure John Wilgus will host the *Sub-Gauge Shoot* again. Don Klages is working on a *SxS/Pump Shoot* and the ever-popular *Bird Shot Challenge* which pits Rattlesnake against the Walla Walla/Milton-Freewater crew will happen once again. *Skeet League* is going to return during the month of May with Dave Otto in charge. *5-Stand League* should return this year as well, look for it as summer starts to give way to fall.

Thank you to everyone who makes the Rattlesnake Mountain Shotgun Range such a great place to shoot! We have a beautiful facility (when the weather cooperates) and we have a great group of volunteers who keep the wheels on and spinning in the right direction.

The Shotgun Range is open until 3:00 p.m. on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays. We do not close the Range early because there are no shooters. Just because there is no one there at 1:00 p.m., does not mean someone won't show up at 2:00 p.m. It is not a short drive out to the Range and we owe it to our fellow shooters to be open during our posted hours.

With the inevitable winter weather rolling in please be careful on the sidewalks and the trap and skeet fields as they can be icy in the morning. There is ice melt in the backroom of the range house that can be used on any slick spots. Also be careful on the steps down into the trap houses and the ramp into the high-house on the skeet field.

With membership renewal season coming up, please remember if you take a TCSA Membership application, whether it is a renewal or a new member, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their new membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the Daily Range Fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

## **HIGH-POWER**

Our schedule is up for the **2023 Calendar Year** at <u>https://www.tcsahighpower.org/</u> Our only competition scheduled for January is a **Precision Rifle 22 Match** on **January 14**. This Match will be held at the HESA Range adjacent to the Rose-Iris Public Range.

Also on our High-Power website, you will also find our updated records list and we had some new records set in 2022. Adam Maxwell, Mike Sowa, Mike McCutchen, Tom Hubbard, Jeremy Smith, Gary Rasmussen, Tom Halecki, Mark Chindavat and Ben Cook all set new Rattlesnake records in various disciplines. Phil Keuhlen also had high scores in two new disciplines not previously fired at Rattlesnake.

The High-Power Range remains open for RSO's with a High-Power Endorsement but **PLEASE** be aware of the weather conditions before you head out. Significant snow combined with the ever-present wind will cause drifts all over the facility, which can make the roads completely impassable. We have spent a lot of money on the roads recently and don't want you to tear them up by getting stuck in a snow drift. If there is any risk of damage to the roads, consider the Range closed!

We shoot a lot of varying disciplines at the High-Power Range, so we have decided to use up a bit of Newsletter space each month describing one of the disciplines a bit. We will feature a different discipline each month, so be sure to check us out in the coming months.

This month we are going to take a look at a few of the **Long-Range Disciplines**, such as **NRA Long Range**, **Palma** and **F-Class**. We are lumping these together here because they are often lumped together in matches. All are fired at the same yardages (typically 800, 900 and 1000) and all are fired from the prone position. They can all be fired on the same firing line at the same time just by varying the number of shots in each string and the scoring rings on the target. The latter is especially easy now with electronic targets, the aiming black is the same size, so we don't have to change the target face, just the electronic scoring calculations made by the system.

**Palma** is what you might call the most "old school" of the Long-Range Disciplines, it is fired prone with a sling, with a purpose-built single shot rifle chambered in either .223 or .308, using match quality iron sights. Most Palma rifles have very long barrels to get the most performance out of what are somewhat limited cartridges, with the added benefit of a longer sight radius too.

**NRA Long Range** is fired with match or service rifles, similar to across the course high-power that we discussed last month. Also added in there is the "Any Rifle" Class, which is not much different than a match

rifle-except that a single shot rifle falls into this class. Like Palma it is fired prone with a sling, but there is no restriction on the cartridge or the sighting system for match or any rifles. Normal service rifle restrictions on action, cartridge and optic still apply, but if you don't fit in the service rifle class you do fit in the match rifle class.

**F-Class** is what you might call the opposite of Palma. It is fired prone, but instead of a sling, shooters can use a bipod or tripod and a rear rest. There is no limit on optics and there are two classes controlled by the cartridge. F-TR is for rifles chambered in .223 or .308, and F-Open is for anything else. This discipline is extremely popular and it is a great place to get started in long range. Just about any rifle/ammo combo that will remain supersonic at 1000 yards will get you started in F-Class and you can add or improve your gear as you progress.

All of these disciplines are fired in various Long-Range Matches throughout the year at Rattlesnake, check the Match Programs to see which Matches are open to which classes and for courses of fire etc.

## HIGH-POWER 2023 CALENDAR AND MATCH DESCRIPTIONS

The High-Power Range Calendar of Events and Match Descriptions for 2023 have been updated. The new calendar is now available on the High-Power website, <u>www.tcsahighpower.org</u>. The Smallbore .22 Caliber Match descriptions are revised and are available on the website. Most of the Large Caliber Match descriptions have also been updated. The Match descriptions provide detailed information on how the match will be run and include a complete listing with dates for the match being described. Take a look at the match descriptions and mark your calendars for the matches you want to participate in.

A total of **63 Smallbore .22 LR Matches** have been scheduled. A new **.22 LR 100 Yard Mini-Palma Match** has been added and shooters will be required to use ammunition provided. Use of ammunition provided is an attempt to help level the playing field. The cost of the ammunition will be included in the match fees.

The year will start with a **PR22 Match** at HESA on **January 14** with Match set up on the 13<sup>th</sup>. The first

large caliber match is **March 18** to shoot a **Long Range V2 Points Series Match**. Changes to matches will be posted on the entry page on the High-Power website. It is suggested that you review the website for changes or match cancellations prior to heading out to the Range. Do not rely on the tcsa.info general calendar for the latest match information.
