PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The New Year brings in quite a few changes for purchasing a firearm in Washington State.

- 1. You must be **21 years of age or older** to purchase any firearm, frame or receiver.
- 2. You must take an **approved required training course** in order to purchase any firearm, frame or receiver.
- 3. All **background checks** go through the Washington State Patrol's SAFE System.
- 4. You will be required to pay an additional **\$18 fee per background check** payable to your Firearms Dealer.
- 5. All firearm purchases require a **mandatory minimum 10 business day wait** after purchase before the firearm can be transferred to the buyer.

Print your course completion certificate. You will be required to show your FFL that you have completed the Firearms Safety Course prior to purchase.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never use a firearm unless you are familiar with how it works.

Membership renewal time is approaching. Early renewals will get you early access to the RSO Duty Day signup calendar to pick your dates for next year.

When renewing, please keep in mind that the 2024 Rose-Iris Range Duty Year runs from **April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025.** If you happen to see openings in March 2023, they are part of this current duty year, and do not count as a date for 2024-2025.

Until the new duty year starts, any 2024 dates you have signed up for can be seen on your RSO Dashboard on the secure RSO web page. The **new dates** you sign-up for **will not show up** on the "Duty Dates" list until April 1, 2024.



ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO AND THE NEXT RSO CLASS

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!


SHOTGUN REPORT

Welcome to 2024 and the month of January! Hopefully everyone had a fun and safe holiday season to end 2023. I am happy to announce we made the turn and the days are getting longer once again. Getting dark at 4:00 p.m. was getting a bit tiresome.

After a successful Turkev Shoot in November, we had an even more successful Christmas Shoot on December 17. All in all, we had about 80 shooters show up and compete for bacon from Hills Meats. We had shooters join us from Post Falls, Idaho, The Dalles, Oregon, Wenatchee, Prosser, Yakima and several other cities and towns from our little corner of the PNW.

Once again Chad and Paulyn Ungerecht did a wonderful job of keeping everyone shooting and well fed throughout the day. I believe we were shooting Annies and Buddy Shoots almost straight through from 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. with a short break 00 for lunch. There was a lot of bacon given



We again owe a big thank-you to Lyle Laughery and Mike Peale for running the upper trap for the shooters who were a little less experienced. From all reports Trap 1 was having as much fun, if not more, than Trap 2.

When you look at the numbers for both the Turkey and Christmas Shoots, we threw just over 4,900 targets, fed approximately 140 shooters, gave away 80 turkeys, 298 pounds of bacon, and several gift cards. It is hard to quantify how much "fun" is had at these shoots but if we go by the smiles, laughter and the amount of good-natured bantering, it is safe to say they are fun. There is also a fair bit of work that goes into these shoots each year, with most of the burden falling on Chad's broad shoulders. Luckily, he is still up to the task. slick spots. Also be careful on the steps down into the trap houses and the ramp into the high-house on the skeet field.

With "Membership Renewal" season just around the corner please be diligent with taking in renewal forms. As a reminder, if you take a NEW TCSA Membership application, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the Daily Range Fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

SHOTGUN RSO INFORMATION

Remember current Membership Cards need to be presented every time a shooter signs in if they want to avoid the Daily Range Fee.

HIGH-POWER

With the new year comes a new calendar! The 2024 High-Power calendar is up on our website, link below. This month there is only one event, a **1000-Yard 1MOA Steel Match** on **January 7**. Come on out and join us for that one and the rest of the month is free for RSO's with a High-Power endorsement to work up a new load or try out that new rifle or gear Santa left in their stocking!

Speaking of the calendar, I would like to take a moment to acknowledge the people who put together our calendar and all the other competition schedules throughout the region. There are 4 full yardage High-Power Ranges in the state of Washington and 4 or 5 weekends in a month, so you would think it would be easy to schedule everyone's events without overlap but let me assure you that it is FAR FROM A SIMPLE TASK!

Each Range has varying schedule pressures and limitations, not to mention the other ranges outside our state to consider like those in Oregon, Idaho and Montana. There are also Regional and National Events to work around and holidays too. The cardinal sin of course is having two or more similar Matches scheduled somewhere near each other on the same weekend, trying to draw the same crowd in different directions. The coordination needed to avoid those issues involves Match Directors of every discipline at each range, coordinated by each range's staff and the state association. These efforts start around September each year and last well into December. So, a big thank you to all our Match Directors who's efforts go toward creating a schedule that works for all involved each year!

As described last month, we will have 3 High-Power Matches in 2024 that will be fired at reduced vardage (200 yards). Any repeating centerfire rifle that can hold at least 5 rounds combined with any decent ammo will be capable of achieving competitive scores. Wind effect will be reduced so it is a great opportunity to work on form and fundamentals without worrying about getting blown onto your neighbor's target. By using the e-targets we won't have to go down range at all during the Match, so we should be able to finish up in less than a couple of hours. The April Match will be a CMP League Match, with scores submitted nationally. The July and August Matches will be club matches only so they will be very informal, just come out and have some fun! If you are a new shooter looking to get into across the course highpower this is a great way to start. If you need more information, contact myself or John Julian, contact information below.

For many of us in the high-power world, winter is the time of year to prep for the upcoming season. Tasks like loading large amounts of ammo, working on gear, maybe building a new rifle or re-barreling an old one is common. Many of us spend some time working on form

and technique using a dry fire trainer like a SCATT or maybe shooting an air rifle in the relative warmth of the garage. When it gets dark at 4:30 though, it can be tough to find enough things to keep the mind occupied. If you find yourself in this boat or just needing something useful to listen to while tinkering or loading ammo, I have got a great suggestion for you, a podcast devoted entirely to high-power rifle! It's called The Highpower Hangout, and you can find it on Apple Podcast, Spotify, Podbay and others. As of this writing there are 32 episodes out there with tons of information on technique, load development, equipment, mental training and many other topics. I met the creator/host "JP" at the nationals at Camp Perry back in 2022 and can tell you he is knowledgeable, entertaining and oh by the way one heck of a shooter too. Check his podcast out, you won't be disappointed!
