With the winter upon us, be sure to **check the road conditions** before driving out to the Range. If we need to close the Range due to weather conditions we will try to get it posted on the **Website and Facebook** as soon as possible.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE – A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and always check every cartridge to make sure it is the correct ammunition for your firearm.

When entering or exiting through the motorized gate at the Rose-Iris Range, please **wait for the gate to close behind you** and verify that anyone passing through with you is an RSO.

Although memberships do not expire until March 31, RSOs that renew early will gain access to the Duty Sign Up Calendar much sooner. Sue will start processing renewals by mid-January, so get your renewal in early if you want the best selection of available duty dates in the 2026-2027 Duty Year.

As the end of the Duty Year approaches please make sure that any swap requests stay within the 2025 duty year (i.e., before 3/31/26). Not that we can't possibly deal with a swap that crosses duty years, but it does kind of complicate things for those of us that keep track of this stuff.

If you happen to be using produce as targets at the **Pistol Bays** (yep, no rule against it...). Please clean up your mess when you leave. We have already established that the local wildlife do not enjoy pumpkin, watermelon and cabbage remains, so please do not assume they will clean it up for you.

RSO Access Key Cards and RSO Badges are not to be used in place of or as a substitute for your Membership identification card.

SHOTGUN REPORT

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year everyone! 2025 is in the rearview mirror and 2026 is coming towards us like a truck with their high beams on! Dramatic, maybe, but it is what it is, and what it is, is a whole new year of shooting opportunities! I think that worked.

Year-end numbers are coming in and it looks like Shotgun will finish a few rounds short of what we did in 2024. While we still put up impressive numbers with 11,400 rounds thrown in 2025, we were down about 700 rounds from 2024. To break that down per discipline, we threw 6508 rounds of Trap, 4105 rounds of Skeet and 787 rounds of 5-Stand.

Our loss numbers were up slightly, which is the wrong way we want those numbers to be trending. As a friendly reminder, a token provides (25) targets to be shot, please refrain from shooting extra targets. A year full of extra targets makes a difference.

2025 was the first full year of our Monthly Non-League League shoots. After compiling all of the results for Trap and Skeet we need to recognize some High-Volume Shoots for the year. 5-Stand was not factored into this as "we" were a little lax with keeping track of results.

Each discipline, Trap and Skeet had two shooters compete in all (12) shoots for the year. No one shot in all (24) shoots though. In the 100 Bird Trap Events, **John Wilgus** and **Steve Williams** each shot at 1200 of the 1200 birds thrown. While in the 50 Bird Skeet events **John Dyes** and **Mark Monopoli** shot at 600 of the 600 birds thrown. Let these individuals serve as your shooting role models for 2026 and beyond.

Of course, this leads to the question of who was the High-Volume Shooter for 2025? Well, it pains me to say it, but **John Wilgus** wins that honor in that he only missed (2) of the Skeet shoots. In doing so John shot at 1700 of the 1800 birds thrown. Really? It isn't enough that he outright wins most of the shoots, we can't even beat him in sheer volume of targets? I mean it only takes attendance, not even any skill. Note to self, new goal for 2026.

SAFE SHOOTING SPORTS OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

Free Trap Sunday will be at 12:00 Noon, **January 4**. Shooters under age 18, accompanied by an adult, can bring their shotguns and shells to the Rattlesnake Mountain Shotgun Range and learn about (or refresh their skills) with up to two rounds of Trap. **Each month in 2026 will feature one Free Shotgun Sunday for youth; alternating between Trap, Skeet and 5-Stand.** If you plan to attend and participate in this activity, please RSVP to president@tcsashotgun.com

Smallbore Rifle Matches will be **Second Saturday and Fourth Sunday of each month April through October**-- Shooters under 18 are invited to participate in .22 Matches at the Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility Smallbore Competition Range. Shooters must be accompanied by an adult. Loaner .22 rifles and ammunition can be made available. Descriptions of the Matches will be published as the season nears.

We are trying to organize a local group for **Youth Hunter Education Challenge (YHEC)**. This program is a natural follow-on for individuals 18 years old or under who may have already completed Hunter Education Training. YHEC features four responsibility events-- Hunter Responsibility Exam, Hunter Safety Trail, Orienteering and Wildlife Identification as well as four shooting events - .22 Rifle, Shotgun, Muzzleloader and Archery. The program includes local, state and national challenges. PRACTICAL PISTOL

USPSA National Range Officers Institute, **NROI**, has a website that has valuable information about the Rules and interpretations of the Rules. Check it out at <https://nroi.org>

TIDBITS: USPSA RULES - concerning the 'external safety'.

DQ offenses for not having the **Safety** on while in the holster or placed on an object. **SAFETY FIRST**, people!!!

10.5.11 Holstering or placing a loaded firearm, in any of the following conditions:

10.5.11.1 A single action self-loading firearm with the safety not applied. If the primary safety on the firearm cannot be engaged due to the design of the firearm and the hammer or trigger cannot be actuated in the condition the gun is in, the safety does not have to be applied. If the gun is completely empty, the safety need not be applied.

10.5.11.2 A double action or selective action pistol with the hammer cocked and the safety not applied.

10.5.11.3 A revolver with the hammer cocked.

All these conditions apply the entire time the firearm is in the holster or placed on an object as required by the Written Stage Briefing. See 8.1.2.5.
