TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

PRIMITIVE USE RANGE: - A Range Area for muzzle loading and primitive Sagebrush Free Trappers reenactment events with parking, staging and various range areas.

We are still waiting for information from WDFW on how we will be able to hold classes. I am still holding out hope we will be able to hold our planned Online Course Evaluations



this fall, starting with a class in August. There are numerous logistical issues to work out in order for us to be able to do that.

Students who are age 9 or older can still complete the entire course through the Online Process. Younger students will have to complete the field exercise in person when classes are again offered.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up after you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up all brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never place or carry a loaded firearm in a vehicle.

High fire danger is with us again and might be for a while. Please keep in mind that when classified as "High Fire Danger",



.50 BMG is not allowed at the Rose-Iris Range. It is posted at the Range House, but call ahead if you are not sure so you don't haul out something you can't shoot.

In the relatively near future, we may have a driveway and event gate at the South end of the Pistol Bays which should help reduce the impact on the Rose-Iris Range and gate control during Events at the Pistol Bays. We will get the word out when/if it comes to be.

RSO Access Key Cards or RSO Badges are not to be used in place of or as a substitute for a Membership Card.

RSOs must have their <u>Membership Card</u> confirming they are a current RSO. Without your current Membership Card, you will need to pay the \$10.00 Daily Use Fee and shoot with the general public.

ALL MEMBERS MUST show their CURRENT 2021 Membership Card to the RSO on duty upon arrival at



the Range. Membership Cards need to be shown at all Ranges and all Events or you will be required to pay the non-member Range Use Fee. EVERYONE must sign-in!

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public -YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become an RSO, you must be a **current member**, attend the RSO Training Class and obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three to four times a year.

HIGH-POWER

We are taking full advantage of daylight in July with Smallbore Matches on the 3, 6, 11, 13, 15, 20, 24 and 25; Service Rifle Practice on the 6, 13, 20 and 27, and a Service Rifle (RMC) Match on the 10th; a 200/300 Prone Slow Fire Match on the 27th; Long Range Practice on the 16th, and Long Range Matches on the 16 and 17. Our full 2021 Match Schedule, Match Director contact, and Match Programs are posted on our High-Power web page at

RANGE CLOSURES or MATCH REVISIONS: Match Director George Hager has added a Smallbore PRS Match on July 25. The Range will be closed the afternoon of the 24th while George and his minions get set up for the Match.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will remain in place for the 2021 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- If you have been vaccinated you don't need to wear a mask; no verification of vaccination is required.
- As a general courtesy, try to bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range remains in good shape, but please use common sense and keep your speed down, particularly on the corners.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It only takes an hour, and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO.
