# **TCSA FACILITIES**

**ROSE-IRIS RANGE** – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

**RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE –** A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

**CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

**COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS** – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

**1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE** – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

**HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE:** This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

### HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

Our next **Online Evaluation** will be on **August 13**. Registration for that Class is currently open on the WDFW



website. We are also tentatively planning an **Online Evaluation** for **September 24**, but the details for that Class have not been finalized at this time.

As noted in last month's Newsletter: On June 1, the minimum age for students to complete the entire Online Course without having to attend an in-person range day was raised from 9 to 18 years old. Students younger than 18 will have to complete the range and other requirements in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and follow all the same safety rules when handling an air gun that are used when handling any firearm.

- If you go out to shoot on a day the Range is closed, make sure you sign in and you are responsible to reload the machines after you are done shooting. Throw away the empty target boxes as well.
- Finally, have fun out there and enjoy yourself. We have one of the nicest Shotgun Ranges you could ever want to shoot at and we should all be happy to show it off. Having just finished a State Shoot down in Oregon at a nice club, I would have to roll around in our parking lot to get close to as dirty as I got just walking around their course.

### **HIGH-POWER**

Things are definitely heating up on High-Power and we are offering the full gamut of Smallbore and High-Power Events throughout the month. Please visit the High-Power page at www.TCSAHighPower.org to review our full 2022 schedule and associated match programs.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

GATE COMBINATION: The Canyon Gate combination has been changed and all High-Power RSOs were notified via email. Contact John Hauptmann if you did not receive the email.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately, our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

**RANGE CONDITIONS:** The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. It is definitely fire season, so behave accordingly.



**HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT:** For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO. Please contact **John Hauptmann** with questions or to schedule your training.
