# **NEXT RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASS**

Our next Range Safety Officer Class with be held on Friday August 22 from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. at the Shotgun Range House. To get your name on the Class List, you have to be a current member of the TCSA. If you can make the Class date and want to become a TCSA Range Safety Officer, send a reply email message to dantini@charter.net with a YES and include your TCSA Membership number and I will add your name to the RSO Class list.

#### **ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO**

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

### **TCSA FACILITIES**

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

**RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE –** A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

**CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

**COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS** – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

**SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE** - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

**HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE:** This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

**RSOs using the HESA Range** are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never shoot at a flat hard surface or water.

#### JUNE REPORT

Our June 14 **Twenty-Five Yard Smallbore Match** was won by **Payten Henderson** with a 200 14X. **Allyxis Henderson** took second place with 198 10X. Allyxis won the June 22 Match with 195 10X and **Izaiah Lane** took second with 194 3X. By popular demand, we shot a second string at 50 yards.

Allyxis scored 192 5X and Izaiah 165 0X at that distance. Going forward; we will allow shooters to opt for 25 or 50 yards for record and we will make a second string available to any shooters who want to stay after the competition.

#### **COMING IN JULY**

25 Yard Youth Smallbore Matches will be Saturday July 12 and Sunday July 27. Registration will run from 7:00 until 7:30 a.m. and the mandatory Safety Briefing will be at 7:45 to beat the heat. # PRACTICAL PISTOL

**TIDBITS:** 5.2.1 Carry and Storage – Except when within the boundaries of a Safety Area or when under the supervision and direct command of a Range Officer, competitors must carry their handguns unloaded in a gun case, gun bag or in a holster securely attached to a belt on their person (see Rule 10.5.1).

5.2.1.2 A competitor who, while not at a Safety Area or under RO supervision, removes their holster or their equipment belt with their handgun still in the holster, shall be considered to be in violation of Rule 5.2.1 and subject to disqualification from the Match. In other words, DO NOT take off your belt with holstered gun at the Port-a-potty or you will be DQd.

### **HIGH-POWER**

Friends and fellow shooters, it is with heavy heart I share with you the news that **Phil Keuhlen** passed away in late June 2025. He was a friend to the Range and instrumental in setting up our Benchrest Rimfire schedule. He also contributed greatly to the effort in bringing our Smallbore Competition Range to full operation. His efforts will be missed but not forgotten.

Looking back at the last month, on the smallbore side of things **John Julian** took the May 31 100/200 Yard Smallbore Match with a 387-12x, which was 13 points and 4x's better than **Charles Bonham's** second place score.

**Ben Cook** won the June 3 50/100 Yard Dewar Match with a clean 400-29x. **Tom Halecki's** 399-31x beat **Mike Bunch's** 399-30x by just a single x, and note either one would have beat Ben's x count had they not dropped a point.

**Tom Halecki** took match winner honors in the June 5 Vintage Smallbore Match with a 400-33x. **Mike Bunch** came in second and took high card with a 200-18x and closest to the tie breaker dot. A little wind caused some problems but great shooting by all involved.

We had good conditions for the June 8 100/200 Yard Smallbore Match. There was very little wind although it was a bit tricky from 200 yards. The match winner was **John Julian** with a 381-8x. Tied for second place were **Charlie Bonham** and **Ron Jorgensen** both shooting 378-6x.

The June 10 USBR Smallbore Benchrest Match started off with a bit of a mess. We looked high and low but could not find any targets. Instead of cancelling, **Tom Walchuck** volunteered a supply of IBS Rimfire targets, which are very similar to the normal USBR targets. Thanks Tom! The day was warm and windy but it did not seem too difficult for match winner **Tom Halecki**, who shot a 495-7x. Hopefully the next Match won't be so hectic!

For the June 12 ARA Smallbore Benchrest Match, once again, the wind took its toll on scores. 10-14 mph was normal with gusts to 28 mph. **Mike Bunch** was Match and High card winner with a 2400-13x & 2125-8x for an aggregate of 4525-21x, followed by **Ben Cook** with a 1850-9x & 2200-12x for an aggregate of 4050 21x. Third place went to **Seth Gardner** with a 2050-5x & 1810-4x for 3860-9x.

At the June 24 Mini-Palma, there were 3 cleans shot, with **Ben Cook's** 450-40x beating **John Julian's** 450-38x and **Mike Bunch's** 450-35x. Overall the top 5 places were separated by just 2 points. I wasn't there but I am guessing it wasn't too windy that day given those scores!

On the centerfire side of things, we had a relatively small turnout for our June 21-22 NRA Regional Match Course and CMP EIC leg match. Spokane's **James Patterson** took top honors both days, with a 755-17x in the RMC and a 476-11x in the leg.

Looking ahead at July, on the smallbore side, we have got a PRS22 on July 6, 50/100 Dewar July 8, Vintage Smallbore July 10, Youth Smallbore July 12, 50 Yard USBR July 15, 50 Yard ARA July 17, 100/200 Smallbore July 19, ELR 22 July 26, another Youth Smallbore July 27, and a Mini-Palma July 29. The scheduled NRL 22 Match on July 5 has been cancelled.

On the centerfire side, we've got a Long Range V2 Points Match July 12, and a reduced yardage (200 yard) Regional Match Course on July 20. The Reduced Yardage Match is a great way to try out across the course high-power without a huge expense. In fact, if you are interested in shooting and can dig up 88 rounds of factory .223 ammo, email me at the address below and I will arrange for you to shoot my backup rifle. First come first served!
