NEXT RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASS

I will not entertain or consider replies I get within a week of the class date so if you are interested, send me your replies right away.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never point a firearm at anything you do not want to shoot.

HIGH-POWER

Wow it is June already, how did that happen?! Warmer weather brings fire danger, so make sure you stay on the gravel roads and follow the ammo rules when you are at the Range. A few other rules reminders based on recent things of note:

- The targets, frames, and other items in the big end conex are for MATCH USE ONLY.
- When using the High-Power Range for general shooting, everyone MUST SIGN IN and pay their day use fee at the small end conex.
- Bullets must impact INTO THE BERM. Bullets that hit in front of the berm can ricochet over it.
- There should be no spent .223 brass lying on the firing point at 1000 yards. There is no factory .223 ammo capable of reliable impacts into the berm at 1000 yards. If you are not handloading 85 or 90 grain bullets in Laupa or similar brass and do not have a rifle set up for Palma, F-class, or Long Range competition, you SHOULD NOT BE ATTEMPTING TO SHOOT A .223 AT 1000 yards.
- The canyon gate combination and the conex box combination have recently changed. If you are supposed to have the combination and don't have it yet, contact Mike Sowa. Note if you are not a High-Power Match Director you will need to be a current High-Power RSO and must have met the requirements for unrestricted access. DON'T GIVE OUT THE COMBINATION TO ANYONE.

Schedule wise for June, on the centerfire side we have got a Long Range V2 Match on June 14, an NRA Approved Regional Match Course on June 21, a CMP EIC Match on June 22 and a 300 Yard Open Any Rifle on June 28. On the smallbore side, we have got a Dewar Match June 3, Vintage Smallbore June 5, 200/300 Yard Smallbore June 7, 100/200 Yard Smallbore June 8, 50 Yard USBR Smallbore June 10, 50 Yard ARA Smallbore June 12, Youth Smallbore Matches (at the new Smallbore Range) on June 14 and 22, a Mini-Palma June 24.

Looking back at Matches last month, on the smallbore side the April 29 **Mini Palma** started out with questionable weather, but it turned into a good day as were the scores. The top three shooters all shot perfect 450s, with **Mike Bunch** edging out **John Julian** and **Ben Cook** with x counts of 44, 37, and 35 respectively.

The May 6 **Dewar Match** had 7 brave souls battle the winds of Rattlesnake. With winds blowing in all directions from 5-14 mph and some gusts even higher we still had some fair scoring. **Ben Cook** was the Match winner (398-30x) with **Mike Bunch** (393-21x) and **Glen Buxton** (386-13x) not far behind.

At the May 8 **Vintage Smallbore Match**, all but one shooter had sporting iron sights. **Tom Halecki** is still dialing in his iron sights so maybe next time he will join the peeping crew. The wind was at our backs and was cooler than expected. **Tom Walchuk** took Match honors with a 400 score and 22 X count. Nice shooting Tom. **Glen Buxton** placed 2nd with a 398 score and took high card with a 200 14 X count. Third was **Mike Bunch** trying out his (new to him) and still dialing it in, Martine rifle with a 397 score.

At the May 14 **USBR Match**, it wasn't exactly a bluebird day. The wind was an intermittent 5 – 10 mph with overcast, but scores did not suffer. **Tom Halecki** shot a very respectful 478-9X for third place. **Mike Bunch** came through with his normal excellence, shooting a 482-10X, but the match winner was one that has stood on the podium many time, **Mr. Ben Cook**. Ben was able to shoot a 491 with 18 Xs. Good shooting to all.

At the May 15 **ARA Match**, the winds of May took their toll on scores at Rattlesnake, with continuous swirling at speeds of 5-10 mph with a few gusts followed by 2 seconds of calm. Only one shooter shot both cards over 2000 and that was **Ben** (Windtalker) **Cook** the Match and High Score Card winner with a fantastic 4200 24x in the wind. Congratulations Ben on the win. **Mike Bunch** was second with a 3925 16x followed by a new shooter to our group, **Jan Schmaling** who shot a 3675 20x. Jan and his wife **Pam** drove all the way from Clarkston Washington to shoot the Match and we hope we made them feel very welcome.

Moving over to the centerfire side of things, the May 4 Long Range Match was well attended, with shooters in F-Open, F-Target and Palma Classes. A spicy wind on Sunday followed a wet and dreary Saturday. When many thought the "Snake" would let them leave with mild winds and a little rain on Saturday - they were proven wrong. Sunday's headwind, switching in both speed and direction demonstrated its power and caused shooters to use the entire target from right-side to left. Several shooters even used the space in between targets to land their shots. In the end, Jay Cristopherson (982-40x) bested the other Open shooters while Mike Sowa (949-26x) lead the Target shooters. Stefan Issacs (941-26x) took the Palma rifle win.

TIDBITS: 5.2.1 Carry and Storage – Except when within the boundaries of a Safety Area or when under the supervision and direct command of a Range Officer, competitors must carry their handguns unloaded in a gun case, gun bag or in a holster securely attached to a belt on their person (see Rule 10.5.1).

5.2.1.2 A competitor who, while not at a Safety Area or under RO supervision, removes their holster or their equipment belt with their handgun still in the holster, shall be considered to be in violation of Rule 5.2.1 and subject to disqualification from the Match. IN OTHER WORDS, DO NOT take off your belt with holstered gun at the Port-a-potty or you will be DOd.

The USPSA Rules:
