NEXT RSO TRAINING CLASS

I will send a reminder message a week before the Class date to those of you who respond.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING AN RSO

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Our next class will be a **Traditional Hunter Education Class** scheduled in June. This Class will meet seven times and run from **June 8** through the **24th**. Registration opened on May 18 and the class filled up in a few days. As I write this the latter part of May, there is still room on the waiting list.

We are planning on offering the field skills evaluations for students who have completed the Online portion of the class in August and September. Those sessions have not been set up yet, so watch future newsletters for more information. Our classes and all other classes offered Statewide are shown on the WDFW website.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.

SAFE SHOOTING SPORTS OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

IN MAY -- We had three shooters for the **Youth .22 Sporter Match** On May 9. **Liam McNeal** took the **George Hager Memorial Medallion** with 521 6X.

We hosted our first **Youth Hunter Education Challenge** on May 16. Only 6 youths participated, but one came all the way from Goldendale. We had seven volunteers, five parents and three observers (including **Jeff Castle**, national NRA Coordinator for YHEC). Our events included **Muzzleloader Shooting, .22 Shooting, Wildlife Identification and Orienteering**. Everyone who attended had good things to say and helpful comments on how we can improve going forward. In the autumn we hope to host another YHEC event including **Archery, Hunter Safety Trail, Shotgun Shooting** and **Hunter Responsibility Exam**.

We also had three shooters for the **Youth 25/50 Match** on May 24. All of them were young ladies from Scouting America. **Andrea Domingos** took first place and won the **Phil Keuhlen Memorial Medallion** with 153 1X. All three shooters shot over 130 in their first competitive match using loaner rifles and plinking grade ammo. We hope they and other members of their organization will make our events part of their itinerary.

June 6, Youth Steel Mini-Match - Registration at Pistol Bays will be at 12:30 p.m. Shooters will learn about firearms safety and the procedures for competitive shooting at steel targets with .22 rifles and pistols. Competition stages involve 5 steel targets engaged from the ready position, with your best 4 times counting for

score. Bring your own firearms as long as they are repeaters (preferably autoloaders). We can provide firearms, but they may poorly fit small shooters. Participants should have prior shooting experience.

June 13, Youth Rimfire 25/50 Match - Relocated to HESA Range while Smallbore Competition Range project is under way. Rose-Iris Gate will be monitored for entry into the Range starting at 8:00 a.m. for registration at HESA. Mandatory safety briefing is at 8:45, and firing begins at 9:00. Shooting will be from the prone position or from bench rests. Shooting will be slow-fire. This is an excellent entry level match for beginners and a fun event for experienced shooters.

June 21, Free Youth Shotgun Sunday - Instruction and shooting begin at 12:00 Noon at the shotgun fields. Shooters under age 18, accompanied by an adult, can bring their shotguns and shells to the Rattlesnake Mountain Shotgun Range and learn about (or refresh their skills) with up to two free rounds of 5-Stand. June 27, Youth Cowboy Experience - Registration at Pistol Bays will be at 12:30 p.m. Introduction to Cowboy Action Shooting. Learn about and shoot single action pistols, lever action rifles and pre-1900 shotguns. Gain an understanding of the realities of the sorts of shooting feats that you see in the movies.

June 28, Youth Rimfire Sporter Match - Relocated to HESA Range while Smallbore Competition Range project is under way. Rose-Iris Gate will be monitored for entry into the Range starting at 8:00 a.m. for registration at HESA. Mandatory safety briefing is at 8:45, and firing begins at 9:00. Shooting will be at 25 and 50 yards from prone, sitting and offhand positions. Shooting will be slow-fire and rapid-fire. Participants should have previous shooting match experience to benefit fully from this event.

HIGH-POWER

Welcome to June everyone! As I write this a number of homeowners are returning home after a wildfire evacuation elsewhere in the county, so it's a great time to remind everyone to be fire hazard aware. Stay on the graveled roads and remember the ammo restrictions. It's amazing how easy it is this time of year to burn down half the state. Don't be the cause of such a mess!

We are (mostly) straightened out on the schedule issues. The High-Power website does not have a calendar up at the moment, but I have been provided the correct calendar and I can confirm it agrees with the high-power and smallbore events shown on the TCSA main website calendar for June. I will save you a few clicks and give the rundown here. On the **Smallbore** side we've got a **50/100 Yard Dewar June 2, Vintage Smallbore June 4, 100/200 Yard Smallbore June 7, Youth Smallbore June 13, 50 Yard ARA Smallbore June 18** and a **100 Yard Mini-Palma June 30**. On the **Centerfire** side we've got a **1000 Yard V2 Points Series Match June 13, 500 Yard Open Any Rifle June 20, 300-Yard Long Gong June 21**, an NRA approved **80 Shot Regional Match Course June 27** and a **CMP EIC (leg) Match June 28**.

Looking back at last month, at the April 28 **Mini-Palma**, nine shooters enjoyed a great day with a light cross wind. **Ben Cook** took full advantage of the conditions and shot a perfect 450-40x for the wind (that's Ben's second match in a row with a 450), followed closely by **John Schneider** with a 449-31x and **Mike Bunch** with a 448-26x.

At the **Vintage Smallbore** on May 7, shooters enjoyed a mild wind compared to some of our other matches. This was a handicap match for scoped rifles. Three shooters used iron sights and 4 used scopes. **Tom Halecki** shot a perfect score of 400-35x, but with the 4-point penalty it knocked him down to 4th place. Great shooting anyway Tom. Good scores were posted with iron sights, **Glen Buxton** was match and high winner with a 400-30x (New record), **Tom Walchuk** came in second with a 398-25x and **Mike Bunch** was 3rd with a 397-20x.

At the May 12 **USBR Match**, we had a very pleasant day with sunny skies and light, breezy, directional conditions to make things interesting. Those conditions would last through both cards which is typically unusual for the Rose-Iris Range. Top shooter for the match was **Mike Bunch** with a 487-9x and also high card with a fine 246-3x. **Ben Cook** was a close second with a 486-14x and **Tom Halecki** third with a 472-11x.

And finally, for Smallbore, the May 17 **22 PRS Match** was shot over 8 stages, with a round count of 98. **Sergey Chub** was first, followed by **Jessiah Lyans** and third place (and top senior) **Ron Icyan**.

On the Centerfire side the reduced yardage across the course match May 9 was lightly attended, with **Dave Baalman** taking the high aggregate with a 751-8x. If you are at all interested in trying out centerfire position shooting, the reduced yardage matches coming up in July and August are a great place to start. They are low pressure, go very quickly on the e-targets and there will be someone there to help you through the course of fire. Bring 80 rounds of any old ammo and whatever you've got that can hold 5 rounds and be reloaded with a magazine or stripper clips and you're guaranteed to have a good time!

Our Sunday **100 Bird Trap Shoot** for June was won by none other than **Don Lint** with a commanding **90/100!** Perpetual winner, **John Wilgus** took second with an **85/100**. Second Lewis class was a bit lower on the score

sheet with **Steve Williams** and **Mark Monopoli** tied at **74/100**.

Second Sunday Skeet Shoot was where things became interesting. (20) shooters braved near perfect weather for (2) rounds of skeet. (20) is the magic number where we go from 2 to 3 Lewis Classes. **John Wilgus** returned to his winning ways with a **49/50** and then there were a whole bunch of ties resulting in 13 of the top 14 scores winning some money.
