TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never cross an obstacle with a loaded firearm.

HIGH-POWER

Wow where did the offseason go? All my plans for dryfire practice and ammo loading failed to follow through on themselves and here I am scrambling to get ammo ready for the season!

Our annual **Match Directors' Meeting** is scheduled for **Wednesday March 6** at 7 p.m. at Rogers Surveying Inc, 1455 Columbia Park Trail, Richland. We will also have an official vote on new officers for the High-Power group. We have currently got volunteers for each position, but if you want to volunteer for something please show up. We promise not to make anything a lifetime appointment.

March starts the busy time of the year for sure. On the Centerfire side of things, we've got a 1MOA Steel Match (1000 yard) on March 3, and the Korean War Memorial Service Rifle Match March 9 - 10. Note there is a special prize for the top M1 in that Match, so gear up accordingly! Then there is a 600-yard Mid-Range Match on the 15th and a V2 Points Series Long Range on the 16th. We round out the month with a 300-yard Open Any Rifle on the 30th.

On the smallbore side of things, we have a **Dewar Match** on the **5th**, a **Vintage Smallbore** on the **7th**, a **50-yard ARA** on the **14th**, a **100/200-yard Smallbore** on the **17th** AND a **Precision Rifle Rimfire** also on the **17th** (on the HESA Range), an **ELR 22** on the **23rd** and round it out with a **100-yard Mini-Palma** on the **26th**.

As you can see Smallbore is pretty busy, thus the planned construction of our new **Smallbore Range** coming soon. On that note I am looking for anyone interested in shooting 3 position, 4 position or prone (traditional) smallbore. I will volunteer to run the Match if there is any interest, just shoot me an email. We will probably start small with just 1-2 matches per year, and then expand from there if there's interest.

TEN RULES OF SAFE GUN HANDLING

- 1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- 2. Firearms should be unloaded when not in use
- 3. Do not rely on your gun's "safety"
- 4. Be sure of your target and what's beyond
- 5. Use correct ammunition
- If your gun fails to fire when the trigger is pulled, handle with care
- 7. Always wear eye and hearing protection when shooting
- 8. Be sure the barrel is clear of obstructions before shooting
- Do not alter or modify your gun and have your guns serviced regularly
- 10. Learn the mechanical and handling characteristics of the firearm you are using

SHOTGUN REPORT

All in all, February went pretty well I think. The weather has been somewhat agreeable but for a little bit of rain and slightly chilly temperatures. All of the machines appear to be working pretty well and we are burning through targets at a pretty good clip.

You may have noticed some targets in the field to the west of the shop building at Shotgun. That would be the new **Archery Range** that was championed by **John Wilgus**. Look for the Archery Report in the other part of the Rattler for more information.

Now that we've got all that new and exciting stuff out of the way, onto Shotgun goings-on! Truth be told, there's not a whole lot going on. I know, but a boring month means everything is working. We did have a very robust turnout the second week of February as we collected 323 tokens across the four fields. Our average for this time of year is 200 per week, so that was nice to see. You can thank the good weather that week for those numbers.

A lot of those tokens are coming from the trap fields right now. With the popularity of the **Sunday 50 Bird Handicap Shoots** and the subsequent practice rounds our little non-league league is doing quite well at bringing out the shooters. Even more importantly, it is a fun time getting together and having everyone take it just serious enough. No matter your ability, or if you've never shot trap before, come on out and join the fun every Sunday at 9:00 a.m. We usually shoot until noon-ish, but the Range is open until 3:00 p.m.

This past week marked Week 1 for the new series of the afore-mentioned Sunday 50 Bird Handicap Shoots and the Klages Buddy Shoots. Each and every Sunday we all get together for a nice little 50 bird trap shoot where everyone starts on the 20 yard line. If you do well and win, you move back 2 yards for the following weeks. Do kind of well and take second place, you only have to move back 1 yard. As the weeks go on the handicap system starts to work its magic and even the playing field for the shooters participating. Following the conclusion of the 50 Bird shoot we've been putting together the Klages Buddy Shoot from the 27-yard line. Essentially, we take first and last, team them up, and the same with second, third and so on. You get to back your buddy up and try to score the best score you can from the 27-yard line. It's challenging and pretty darn fun all at the same time.

The first Week saw **John Wilgus** take the win with a high score of a 48 while **Jay Judy** shot a 46 for second place. John will be moving back to the 22-yard line while Jay will be moving back to the 21.

As mentioned prior, the Shotgun Range has been pretty quiet as of late. Which means I'm going to run out of things to write about. So, just like most of my papers in college, I will start to fill.

Actually, we have a couple of things about opening the Range on non-public days to discuss. One advantage of being an RSO is that you get to shoot whenever you'd like. But if you shoot you need to close down the Range just like any of your other duty days. Machines need to be left full, empty boxes need to be removed from the houses and everything needs to be locked up and shut off properly. Please do not change adjustments on the machines. Skeet targets and Trap targets are thrown at a certain speed, adjust your shooting to the targets, not the other way around. If you have non-members out at the Range with you, yes, they still have to pay the Daily Range Use Fee. As always, everyone needs to sign in, whether they are shooting or not. In closing, if you have a question or need direction, please feel free to call me. My number is posted at the RSO Desk and will be in each house soon. I'd much rather take a phone call then replace a hydraulic motor, again. Last but not least, yes you need to stop and put the chain back up as you leave the Shotgun Range. (Note from Sue Verwest – this chain is very heavy)

All in all, we've been pretty good about things, but sometimes we might get a little lax on our post-shooting duties. Thank you to all of our Range Safety Officers for opening the Range in good and bad weather. Together we have one of the nicest Shotgun Ranges in the PNW.

Finally, we have **Hero Volunteer of the Month!** We're giving this to a couple of people this month. **John Dyes** and **Tom Walchuk** have been doing a great job of cleaning the fields on a weekly basis. Not quite as good as **Ron Geiger** did, but they're young and just getting their feet wet. They'll get there. Next, we have **Mike Inglima** and **John Wilgus** who have been going out and tackling some of the smaller jobs that popup. Notably they have been working on painting the yardage number on the trap fields. Sure, they started in the middle, and then ran out of paint, but what is done looks perfect. Thanks, guys, for your help!

ARCHERY REPORT

Shotgun Range, non-shotgun goings on. You may have noticed some 3-D archery targets in the field to the West of the shop building at Shotgun. That would be the newly approved and ready to use **Archery Range** that was spearheaded by **John Wilgus**. The **TCSA Board** voted to approve the installation of the Archery Range at the February Board Meeting.

John has been collecting targets over the past year or so and has donated them to be used on the new Range. The more targets the better, so if you have any laying around and would like to donate them, they will be gladly accepted.

The Archery Range will only be available to current RSO's and their guests. It is not currently available for use by the general public. The sign-in sheet for Archery will be in the Shotgun Range House, where all users will need to sign-in and any range fees for non-members will be collected. There will be an established firing line along the North side of the old access road that used to go to the road to High Power. The Archery Range will extend 100 yards to the Northwest-ish. See the map.

TARGET Arrows only. No broadhead or hunting tips allowed. The full set of rules and regulations will be posted with the sign-in sheet at Shotgun. Like all the TCSA Ranges, all visitors need to sign-in, whether they are shooting or not.

APPROVED RANGE RULES FOR ARCHERY

- Only current RSO's, and their guests may use the Archery Range at this time.
- Range Use and Agreement form will be located at the Shotgun RSO desk. This form is separate from the Shotgun form.
- All RO/RSOs and their guests, including children under 18 accessing the Archery Range must sign the Range Use and Agreement form located at the RSO Station in the Shotgun Range house, even if already signed in elsewhere on the range. The RO/RSO is responsible for providing RSO safety oversight of their non-RO/RSO guests while they are on the Archery Range. Eye protection is required while shooting. The RO/RSO is also responsible for the collection and deposition of the nonmember \$10 Daily Use Fees of their guests in the Shotgun safe.
 - Eye protection is required at all times while on the Archery Range.

- The red flag at the Shotgun Range will be used while the Archery Range is open.
- Maximum target range is 100 yards.
