TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

PRIMITIVE USE RANGE: - A Range Area for muzzle loading and primitive Sagebrush Free Trappers reenactment events with parking, staging and various range areas.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

Our next online evaluation will be on **May 14**. Registration is currently open for that session on the WDFW website.



We have decided not to offer a Traditional Class in June. That class frequently had low student numbers in the past and given the very low student numbers we have seen this year; we will not be offering that class.

Following the May Class, our next **Online Evaluation** will be on **August 13**. Registration for that Class is currently open on the WDFW website.

On **June 1**, the minimum age for students to complete the entire Online Course without having to attend an inperson range day will be raised from 9 to 12 years old. Younger students will have to complete the range and other requirements in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and always check every cartridge to make sure it is the correct ammunition for your firearm.

Those who renewed before March 31 will have a chance in winning the Ruger 10/22. The drawing for the Ruger will take place at the General Membership Meeting on May 12.



target presentations. Unfortunately, due to high demand and Phil's sharpie running out of ink we had to cancel the autograph sessions. Word is that Phil's free advice single handedly lowered the scores of several shooters, which if we were golfing would be a good thing.

You will probably be reading this about the same time we are shooting the **BIRDSHOT CHALLENGE** on **April 30** and **May 1.** If not, and you want to join in on the fun shoot me an email or visit our website for more details. The flier is posted at the top of the screen. The "menu" has been set for all 3 of the clubs we are visiting. 5-Stand, Super Sporting, Continental Doubles, Skeet and Skeet Crossers are all being served up in one variation or another. It will be a fun shoot consisting of 200 total rounds for the weekend.

The **SUB-GAUGE SHOOT** is scheduled for **June 12**. If you are a fan of shooting Sub-Gauges this is the shoot for you! Expect to shoot a variety of Skeet/Trap/5-Stand and all things in between. Each gauge will be reverse handicapped to even the playing field a bit. Last year if you shot a .410 you received an extra 5 birds per event over the 20-gauge shooters. This is a fun shoot that moves quickly, has a low entry fee, pays back well and is a great reason to dust off your little guns.

Maddox McQuary and Troop 249 have completed the landscaping project on the hillside between the Skeet and 5-Stand field. Maddox and company did a great job digging the holes for the new plants, completing the drip irrigation lines and then getting the new plants in the ground. HIGH-POWER

Our Match season will hit its stride in May with Smallbore Matches on the 3rd, 5th, 10th, 12th, 17th and 29th; Service Rifle on the 21st and 22nd; Mid-Range on the 1st and 24th; and Long Range on 12th - 15th. Please visit the High-Power web page at https://www.tc21st & 22ndsahighpower.org/ to review our full 2022 schedule and associated Match Programs.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: We are looking for volunteers to help with the **Palma Long Rang Regional** on **May 12** - **15** and the **Regional Match Course (RMC)** on **May 21** - **22**. If you are willing and available, please contact **John Hauptmann** at ilhauptmann@gmail.com / 509-308-9230.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. Be aware that conditions in the Canyon may be different than elsewhere on the Range and avoid soft or muddy areas as best you can.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO.
