TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Classes take most of the day. We start at the HESA Range in the morning, then move to the Richland Community Center in the afternoon.

The June Traditional Class will start on Monday June 12 and finish on Thursday June 29. Registration for this Class is also open on the WDFW website and there are currently seats available.

We are anticipating holding additional **Evaluation Classes** for online students in **August** and **September**. Information on our Classes and all other Hunter Ed Classes is available on the WDFW website.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and store firearms and ammunition separately.

NEW GONGS AT ROSE-IRIS

All the old boiler plate gongs have now been replaced with free-swinging AR-500 targets and the berms have been repaired to increase visibility and get some dirt behind all of them.

Many thanks to **Paul Werner** for the tractor work and rigging all the old steel out, **Seth Gardner** for the cutting torch to remove the old ones and providing a lot of grunt labor and installation expertise for the new installations, and to **Dave McNeal** for making sure no one shot at us while we were up on the mountain.

It was hard to capture a good picture of what is out there now. You will just have to go out to the Range and see for yourself! But here is an example of why the old ones needed replacing.



The new targets are somewhat smaller and more challenging than the previous ones, size largely driven by what we could get out of an existing chunk of AR, but when you hit them, you can hear the ring halfway to town.

All the gongs and stands now on the hill are fabricated by **Seth Gardner** of **D-M Targets** (give their website a look) and the 200-yard target has taken several years of abuse and still looks great.

Target dimensions:

200 yards - 12"

250 yards - 15"

300 yards - 16" and 6"

350 yards - 18" and 7"

400 yards - 20" and 8"

450 yards - 21", 9" and the one in the middle is about 3" wide x 4" tall



HIGH-POWER

It has been a busy month at the High-Power Range as usual. We started off on April 4 with a **50/100 Yard Dewar Smallbore Match**. 8 shooters were treated to weather that "was not too awful" and wind that was a bit "switchy". **Brandon Tinker** was the match winner with a 392-19x, followed closely by **Phil Keuhlen** with a 390-21x. Phil also managed a clean target at 50 yards. Thanks as always to **Tex Long** for running the line and helping with scores.

April 8 was a scheduled RMC across the course center fire match. Poor planning on our part had this scheduled for Easter weekend, so attendance was light. Shooters present decided to call an audible and shoot the 50 Shot National Match Course as a practice instead, taking advantage of excellent conditions (I actually confirmed my no wind zero at 600 yards, I didn't know I had a no wind zero before that day). **John Julian** had the top score of the day which went otherwise unreported as it was just a Practice Match.

April 11 was a Smallbore Benchrest Match, with conditions providing a test of everyone's wind endurance (what a difference a few days makes!). Note from the Match Director: "Those folks tough enough to hang in there and complete the match surely deserve respect from the remainder of us. As Seth observed 'warn't no new records today.' No targets blew over during the competition. We (as a group) are getting better at setting targets if not punching accurate holes into them. Phil Keuhlen was again the top score with a 236-0x and David Vance was second with a 228-1x. Editor's note: those scores alone should tell you how windy it was!

There was a Long Range V2 Points Series Match (5 strings at 1000 yards) on April 15, but no report was available at press time.

April 18th was a 100 Yard Mini-Palma Match. Conditions were again difficult. From the Match Director: "It seems that there are at least four very foolish young shooters. All four showed up this morning in the howling winds to shoot." **Ron Jorgensen** was the top score with a 419-14x, just beating **John Julian** by x count with his 419-12x. They shot wildly different scores on the 800-and 900-yard targets and only shot the same score at 1000. To wind up tied for score in those conditions is quite rare! Special thanks to **Ron Jorgensen** for running the line and pits on the off relay.

The weather finally improved April 25 for the Centerfire 200/300 Yard Match. **Kaleb Harvey** led the field with a clean 200-18x, edging out **Ben Cook's** 199-8x. Well done Kaleb and that's believed to be a new record score for this Match at Rattlesnake!

Looking ahead to the schedule for May, Smallbore continues to be busy with a Dewar Match on May 2, Vintage Smallbore on May 4, 50 Yard Benchrest on May 9, 50 Yard ARA on May 11, 100 Yard Mini-Palma on May 16, and a PR 22 Match on May 28.

The **50 BMG** group get their season going **May 5, 6** and **7** with a **Benchrest Match**.

On the across the course high-power side of things we have an NRA approved Regional Match Course on May 13 and a CMP EIC "Leg" Match on May 14. This is a chance to earn an NRA High-Power Classification on Saturday and earn "leg" points on Sunday toward the Distinguished Rifleman Badge. We expect a decent turn out for this Match, including a contingent from the Washington Warriors Junior High-Power Team, as it is the beginning of their prep season before the National Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio. Long range has a **Palma Match** schedule for **May 19**, **20** and **21** and we will round out the center fire schedule with a **200/300 Yard Match** on **May 23**.

Another way to enjoy the perfectly manicured lawns of our little Range is to come out on Saturdays during the month of May for *Skeet League 2023!* League will be held on each Saturday during the month beginning on May 6 and ending on May 27. We will be scoring 10 rounds of Skeet and you can shoot as many rounds in a day as you can handle. Cold gun, meaning if you shoot it, you score it, no warm-up rounds. Skeet League is a good time and if you don't crack under the pressure you can be immortalized for all time on the Skeet League Championship Trophy! Sunday, June 4 we will be at Rattlesnake all morning for (50) 5-Stand targets on a Signature Phil Volkman designed course, followed by the ever popular 30 Yard Skeet Crossers. You can come and shoot both days, or just one. If you want your score to contribute to the overall club score you do need to shoot both days. Every year this shoot proves to be a good time and the results are always close. Rattlesnake has won the last 4 years and we are looking to stretch that out to year 5! The 1st Annual Don Klages Side-by-Side and Pump Gun Shoot was a resounding success! 33 shooters from far and wide came out to put their trusty pump guns and side-by-sides to the test.
