TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never shoot at a flat hard surface or water.

HIGH-POWER

Another month has flown by and May is now upon us. It is another busy one as usual. On the Centerfire side of things we've got the Long-Range Spring Regional May 3-5, a Regional Match Course on May 11 and 50 BMG May 17-19. If you plan to attend the RMC on May 11, be sure to let John Julian or Dave Baalman know if you will be there so we can have targets ready for you.

Matches of the smallbore persuasion include a 50-100 Yard Dewar May 7, Vintage Smallbore May 9, 50 Yard Smallbore Benchrest May 14, 50 Yard ARA May 16, Precision Rifle 22 May 19 (at HESA), ELR 22 May 25, 100/200 Smallbore May 26, and a 100 Yard Mini-Palma May 28.

Looking back at April, we had our first ever **CMP** across the course league match (reduced yardage) on April 13.

Surprisingly we had great conditions and probably could have shot the match full yardage with minimal change to the overall scores. Our winner was Walla Walla's **Mark Tennier** with a 481-17x. Second was **Dave Baalman** with a 478-15x, and **John Julian** was third with a 460-8x.

The first **Mini Palma Match** of the year was March 26, the conditions were cold and windy, but the turnout was good. There were 3 clean targets in the Match and the top 4 contestants were separated by less than 1%. **Phil Keuhlen** was overall winner with a score of 448-25x, **Jeff Davis** was second with a 445-22x and **Ron Jorgensen** was third with a 444-19x.

Temperature was much better for the April 2 **50-100 Dewar Match.** Wind on the other hand was not as cooperative. Despite the conditions, seven of the twelve competitors had over a 98% aggregate. **Phil Keuhlen** was the overall winner with a 398-30x. **Ben Cook** was second with a 397-31x (proving once again that x's don't matter unless you tie for score). **Brandon Tinker** was third with a 395-25x.

The April 4 Vintage Smallbore was back to windy, cold and wet weather. Despite the conditions, three shooters fired clean raw scores on both targets. Congratulations to Glen Buxton, Tom Halecki and Gary Meerdink! After the handicap was applied, Glen Buxton was the winner with a 200-16x, followed by Mike Bunch with a 196-9x and Tom Halecki with a 197-17x.

For the April 7 **100/200 Smallbore Match**, only 2 shooters braved the wind. **Ron Jorgensen** was Match winner with a 385-13x and **John Julian** was second with a 383-11x.

The April 9 **Smallbore Benchrest Match** was another windy affair. Scores were severely depressed from the group norms and there were no cleans and very few x's. **Tom Halecki** took all the honors being Match Winner at 473-4X and the high card award for his 2nd card at 240-2X. Tom also had the high overall X count at 4. **Gary Meerdink** was second at 456-2X. **Glen Buxton** was third at 425-3X.

The April 11 **ARA Smallbore Match** was chilly but very light winds. **Mike Bunch** was overall winner while setting new 2024 marks for both high card and aggregate scores, with a 4300-15x. **Phil Keuhlen** was second with a 4075-16x, and **Brandon Tinker** was third with a 3885-12x.

Rounding out our Match reports is the April 23 **100 Yard Smallbore Match**, which had much better conditions than the last few matches. In fact, no one shot below 94%. **Gary Meerdink, Phil Keuhlen, John Julian, Ben Cook** and **Tom Walchuk** all had at least one clean target. **Gary Meerdink** was the overall winner with a 450-3x, followed closely by **Phil Keuhlen** with a 450-31x and **John Julian** with a 449-33x. I guess this is one where scores and x's both mattered!

SHOTGUN REPORT

First and foremost, **Shotgun is now open until 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays** during the summer months.

SHOTGUN RANGE IS CLOSED MAY 12 FOR MOTHER'S DAY

Yes, I know, the website is still down. We are working on it. **Eric Johnson** put in a valiant effort to resuscitate the old one, but to no avail. Thanks for trying Eric! We are going to sunset the old one and start anew. If you have knowledge of this type of thing, I welcome your help. Eventually we will persevere, it is just how much we struggle getting there.

One thing that we have already upgraded to new and shiny are the voice calls on the Trap fields. While the old ones frequently got their feelings hurt when people yelled at them, resulting in "no calls", the new ones are cold as ice. The new BRB Wireless System doesn't care if you yell at them or use the "low and slow" call, they just work. And they work well.

The new calls work pretty much the same as the old calls with a few key upgrades and differences. There are several fliers posted at Shotgun that explain how to use the new system, but as I have learned, some of you are averse to reading any information posted at Shotgun. So, here we go with a quick breakdown:

- The new voice calls are re-chargeable now. They will still be stored in the Trap houses but will be plugged in at the end of each day.
- The voice calls will time out after a period of non-use. I believe it is 30 minutes.
- The power button for each voice call is on top of the voice box. It has a circular green light, and makes an audible chime when it turns on.
- The chargers plug into the bottom of each voice box.
- There is still an "ON" button located next to the token machine on each field. It is now blue instead of green, and you push the "Mic On" button rather than the old "Power" button.
- The biggest difference, or thing to know, is that all of the individual voice calls need to be powered "On" PRIOR to pushing the "Mic On" button.
- The circular green light will flash when it is in standby, and will change to solid green when it is "armed".
- The token system works exactly the same for now.

Next upgrade will be a new system on the Skeet Fields. They will also be a wireless system from BRB and will work in a very similar way to the existing system. Most likely Skeet Field 1 will be upgraded by the time you read this.

Shotgun took possession of (23) pallets of targets last month and we need all the help we can get shooting them up! How many targets is that? Well, (23) pallets is (1449) cases and at (135) targets per case that means we have (195,165) individual targets to shoot. While they don't go bad, we do need to help them fulfill their destiny of being turned to dust.

The **Sunday 50 Bird Handicap Shoots** are still going strong. While attendance varies week to week, it is still a darn good time. Currently we have shooters spread out from the 20-yard line all the way out to the 27-yard line. This past Sunday **Stu Bruce** decided to break out his trusty Browning 725 and laid waste to everyone with a 23 and 25 to score a strong 48/50 from the 20-yard line. The funny thing is that Stu swore off shooting on Sundays two weeks ago. His self-imposed embargo lasted exactly one week because **Mrs. Stu Bruce** got tired of Stu moping around the house. Now we are stuck with him again, and we're the better for it.

Stu wasn't done with just winning the handicap shoot, nope. Stu decided to win the **Don Klages 27 Yard Annie Shoot** as well. Stu allegedly won \$50+ for his wins. Great shooting Stu!

Hero Volunteer of the Month is fairly straight forward this time. With Ron Geiger taking some time off from Shotgun, Tom Walchuk and John Dyes have really stepped up and are doing a lot of work at the Range. Tom did a good job of getting the fields fertilized and the sprinklers up and running. While John helps with everything from cleaning the fields to loading targets into the houses. Thank you!

With Membership Renewal season still going strong please remember to give out temporary membership cards to all new members. Please make sure they understand they will need to present the temporary card every time while they wait for their permanent card to come in the mail.

Thank you to everyone for volunteering at the Shotgun Range. If you have the time, come out and enjoy shooting at this great Range of ours.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range.
