YOUTH INTRODUCTION TO BLACK POWDER

This Event will be held on **May 17** for youth ages 12-17. This is an opportunity to come out and learn about muzzleloading firearms. Youth will be able to shoot both flintlock and percussion rifles and pistols.

There will be two sessions -- 9:00 to 10:30 and 10:30 to noon. More details for this Event in the Primitive Article on page 4.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

We held our April 26 Evaluation for students who had completed the online



portion of the hybrid course. Of the 17 students registered, 12 attended class (one had called in sick) and all 12 passed the class. We have one additional Field Skills Evaluation scheduled this spring which will be held on **May 10.** Registration is currently open on the WDFW website for that session.

Our June **Traditional Class** is set up and will run from **June 16** through **July 3**. Registration will open on **May 26**, and like our Online Evaluations, our Traditional Classes have been filling up quickly.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never cross obstacles with a loaded firearm.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

Free Trap Sunday was on April 6 - We had three young shooters participate in a two-round match. **Eli McNeal** took high score. Thank you, **Mark Monopoli** for running the Match and coaching the shooters!

25 Yard Youth Smallbore Matches

We held three Orientation sessions with young shooters and their adults and with RSOs to prepare them for a successful series of Smallbore Matches. We had 11 adults with 14 pre-18ers and 4 RSOs aboard following the Orientations. Thank you, **Phil Keuhlen**, for making this possible!

The inaugural event for the new Smallbore Competition Range was the First 2025 **Youth 25 Yard Smallbore Match**, April 12 with 8 shooters and their accompanying adults participating. The wind was brisk enough to require stabilizers on the target frames, but the **scores were impressive. Even more impressive was the conduct of the shooters**. Shooters ranged in age from 9 to 16. The second Match was April 27 with higher windspeeds and 10 shooters showing **impeccable conduct and great marksmanship**.

While the format is a Match, we try to avoid over-competitiveness. The shooters have varying degrees of experience, the firearms range from scoped sporters to fairly sophisticated target rifles, ammunition is mostly (but not all) plinker grade and the accompanying adults have a range of coaching experience. We encourage the participants to strive for self-improvement rather than "winning" at this point in their shooting development.

HIGH-POWER

April has flown by and May is upon us. So far, the weather has offered little excuse not to compete and/or practice. May looks like more of the same, so get yourself to the range at your first opportunity!

May's schedule is pretty jam packed as always. On the centerfire side of things, we have got the Spring Long Range Regional May 2 - 4, a full yardage Regional Match Course May 10, and a 50 BMG Match May 16 - 18. On the smallbore side we have got a 50/100 Yard Dewar on May 6, Vintage Smallbore on May 8, 50 Yard USBR Smallbore May 13, 50 Yard ARA Smallbore May 15, ELR 22 Steel on May 24, a Youth Smallbore Match May 10 and 25, a 100 Yard Mini-Palma May 27, and a 100/200 Yard Smallbore May 31.

On the "too late for the April newsletter" list from March was the March 25 Mini-Palma. Ben Cook took the overall win with a 450-43x. That's only 2 x's shy of absolute perfection! Well done, Ben! Mike Bunch was second with a 450-37x and Tom Walchuck was third with 450-33x. The top 7 places in this Match were all within 3 points, impressive shooting!

Moving on to April, we kicked things off with a High-Power **Reduced Yardage Match** on April 5. **Adam Maxwell** took every stage and overall, with a 778-17x. Nicely done!

The April 6 **100/200 Yard Smallbore Match** had great conditions, with very little wind although it was a bit tricky from 200 yards. Three of the nine shooters shot a clean 200 from 100 yards. The match winner was **Tom Walchuk** with a 393 and 18 x's. This was the first time Tom has shot this match so congratulations Tom. **John Julian** also posted a 393 but was one X from Tom with 17x's. Third place went to **Ben Cook** who shot a 391 and 21 X's. Ben's X count was high for the match.

The April 8 **Dewar Match** was held under mild temperatures and strong winds. Winds of 5-15 mph were common along with gusts up to 27 mph. We had a great turnout for the challenging weather conditions, 12 shooters in all. **Tom Walchuk** was the match winner with a 396/13X, then **Ben Cook** 2nd with a 394/26X and **Mike Bunch** 3rd and high card winner with a 200/15X on the 50 yard target.

The April 10 Vintage Smallbore Match had mild winds, with 3 mph at the most and some excellent scores were recorded. This Match was shot with no handicap for scoped rifles. Glen Clifford was the match winner with a 400 total score/ 40 X count and hit the tie breaker dot. Tom Halecki placed 2nd with a 400 total score, 40 X count but did not hit the tie breaker dot. Brandon Tinker placed 4th

with a 400 score and 39 X count and center punched the tie breaker dot edging **Mike Bunch** who also shot a 400 with 39 X count but was not center punch the dot. Great shooting non the less. There were 3 more perfect scores shot with various X counts. Big hand to our junior shooter **Jackson Farmer** for competing. Great to see some interest from younger eyes.

The April 17 **ARA Smallbore Match** had beautiful weather, sunshine and a very light breeze. We had a light turnout of shooters but still posted several scores over the 4000 mark. **Mike Bunch** won both the Match and High card score with a 4375-29x & 2300-17x respectively, with **Ben Cook** close behind at 4100-21x. Thoughts and prayers to **Gary, Phil** and **David** for their speedy recoveries and back to the range soon. TIDBITS: 5.2.1 Carry and Storage – Except when within the boundaries of a Safety Area or when under the supervision and direct command of a Range Officer, competitors must carry their handguns unloaded in a gun case, gun bag or in a holster securely attached to a belt on their person (see Rule 10.5.1).

5.2.1.2 A competitor who, while not at a Safety Area or under RO supervision, removes their holster or their equipment belt with their handgun still in the holster, shall be considered to be in violation of Rule 5.2.1 and subject to disqualification from the Match. IN OTHER WORDS, DO NOT take off your belt with holstered gun at the Port-a-potty or you will be DQd.
