Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

We have completed our Classes for the calendar year. I anticipate our next Class will be a Traditional Class starting in mid-January 2026. I haven't yet started the scheduling process for this Class, so stay tuned.



Other Field Skills Evaluations are shown on the WDFW website. As more instructors start fall hunting, there are typically fewer classes available and they tend to fill up quickly. Be prepared to travel farther to get in a class that fits your schedule.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never use alcohol or drugs before or during shooting.

SAFE SHOOTING SPORTS OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

OCTOBER REPORT:

We wrapped up the **2025 Youth Smallbore 25/50 Yard Match Season** with Matches on the 11th (see the Highpower item in this Newsletter for details) and the 26th. On the 26th we had one new shooter (another cadet from Hanford High JROTC); using one of our loaner rifles, cadet **Jonah Niedziela** won at 25 yards with 195 8X. Pretty much as usual, cadet **Anna Winkel** won at 50 yards with 196 7X. Over the course of the season 21 youth shot at least one full Match. **Liam McNeal** was the most prolific shooter with 12 of the 14 matches to his credit and **Anna** shot 11 matches.

COMING IN NOVEMBER:

Free Shotgun Skeet Sunday will be November 9 at 12:00 Noon. Shooters aged 18 and under, accompanied by an adult, can bring their shotguns and shells to the Rattlesnake Mountain Shotgun Range and learn about (or refresh their skills) with two free rounds of skeet. The .22 Rimfire Sporter Match scheduled for November 8 is an opportunity for young shooters to match their marksmanship skills against adults and use types of .22 rifles that have not been part of our 25–50-yard season of Matches. TIDBITS: USPSA RULES - concerning the 'external safety'.

DQ offenses for not having the <u>Safety</u> on while in the holster or placed on an object. **SAFETY FIRST**, people!!!

10.5.11 Holstering or placing a loaded firearm, in any of the following conditions:

10.5.11.1 A single action self-loading firearm with the safety not applied. If the primary safety on the firearm cannot be engaged due to the design of the firearm and the hammer or trigger cannot be actuated in the condition the gun is in, the safety does not have to be applied. If the gun is completely empty, the safety need not be applied.

10.5.11.2 A double action or selective action pistol with the hammer cocked and the safety not applied.

10.5.11.3 A revolver with the hammer cocked.

All these conditions apply the entire time the firearm is in the holster or placed on an object as required by the Written Stage Briefing. See 8.1.2.5.

HIGH-POWER

Well, it is November already and with that the season is winding down. There will be plenty of time for all you High-Power certified RSO's to get some range time on some upcoming weekends. If history is any indication, you should get a nice mix of no wind zeros and significant wind practice, with little between. Enjoy it while you can! Also, it is a good time to remind everyone to watch your email for unexpected closures. If we get a big accumulation of snow, we will shut the High-Power Range down to prevent damage to the roads.

Schedule wise for November, it is almost all Smallbore. We have got an NRL22 Match on November 1, PRS22 on November 2, 50/100-Yard Dewar November 4, Vintage Smallbore November 6, CMP Rimfire Sporter November 8, 50-Yard USBR Smallbore November 11, and 50-Yard ARA Smallbore November 13. Our lone Centerfire Match is the "Black Friday I'm Not Going Shopping" Match on Friday November 28.

Looking back at the end of September and October, which again was a smallbore heavy month, at the September 28 **Youth Smallbore Match**, we had excellent shooting conditions for temperature, wind was light, along with the usual exemplary behavior and safety practices by our shooters. Of the eight shooters, three competed at 25 yards and five stretched their competitive skill out to 50 yards. **Elyse Winkel** won at 25 yards with 197-10x, and **Eli McNeal** won at 50 yards with 197-13X (closely followed by **Anna Winkel with** 196-6x).

At the September 30 **Mini-Palma**, weather was beautiful, warm temperatures and light breeze turned out some good scores. Two shooters shot a clean 450 and a third shooter shot 449 and three shooters shot 447, with the remaining shooters not far behind. **Ben Cook** won the Match based on a higher X count. **John Julian** also shot 450 but ended up second the result of an X count tie breaker.

The October 7 **Dewar Match** was a little chilly early with a light wind. The scores were a little off due to changing wind direction but not too bad. Congratulations to **Ben Cook** who took Match win and High Card honors (400-28x & 200-17x respectively) followed by a three-way tie between **Mike Bunch** (398-28x) who edged out **Tom Halecki** (398-27x) and **John Julian** (398-24x) for 2nd place by X count alone.

The October 9 **Vintage Smallbore Match** went well as far as the weather and wind cooperating. **Tom Halecki** took overall match honors as well as high card with a 400-38x. **Mike Bunch** was second with a 400-35x, and **Lisa Bunch** was third with 400-27x. Great shooting and great fun for all competitors.

At the October 11 **Youth Smallbore Match**, we had seven shooters show up just after the rain showers stopped and the wind velocity dropped. We welcomed **D'Aaron Orr** as a new shooter and two of our regular shooters had to drop out because of targeting issues during the match. **Anna Winkel** won at 50 yards with 198-7x and **Dylan Gray** won at 25 yards with 196-7x using a new rifle for the first time. Well done!

At the October 16 **ARA Smallbore Match**, the weather was pretty dang cool starting the Match with an occasional fog bank rolling through the targets. The weather necessitated frequent scope adjustments and ammo changes during the Match, possibly from the dense air and 37-degree temperature. The scores didn't reflect the lack of wind we enjoyed however. **Mike Bunch** took Match win and high card honors (4225-24x & 2200-15x respectively) barely edging out **Ben Cook** (4175-24x) and **Tom Halecki** (3260-12x).

And finally, the October **USBR Match** was rescheduled to the 21st due to extreme wind on the scheduled day. Conditions this time around were far more favorable and shooter friendly. Cool temps and hardly any wind, but what wind there was workable, it made wind reading more of a consideration rather than a requirement. The light breezes would move in and then after a few seconds dissipate long enough for you to take a shot and this repeated itself through the two-card match. **Ben Cook** was Match winner and High Card (493-12x & 247-5x respectively). Thanks to **Mike Bunch** for helping out and thanks to all our participants for helping keep the range clean and the matches running!
