Hours of Operation 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber. High-Power Rep. – John Julian – 509.308.0376

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We held our last Class of the year on September 24, where all fourteen students passed and will receive their Hunter Education Cards. I anticipate our next Class will be a Traditional Class starting in January 2023.



On June 1, 2022 the minimum age for students to complete the entire Online Course without having to attend an in-person range day was raised from 9 to 18 years old. Students younger than 18 will have to complete the range and other requirements in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it were loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never use a firearm unless you are familiar with how it works.

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately, our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. It is definitely fire season, so behave accordingly.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO. Thank you to all of the RSO's for volunteering your time week in and week out at the Shotgun Range. Also, thank you and welcome to all of the new RSO's who came on board in the last couple of months. Without all of you volunteering for your minimum of (3) duty days per year the Range would have a hard time staying open consistent hours.

Something of note is that the Shotgun Range has set hours of operation that are posted to numerous places. We are required to have those set hours and we are required to keep the Range open during those hours. While it can be slow on certain afternoons there are all kinds of things we can be working on:

- 1. Make sure all the empty cardboard boxes are removed from the trap and skeet houses.
- 2. Sweep out the trap and skeet houses to remove any target chips or debris.
- 3. Make sure garbage cans are emptied, if full.
- 4. If no one is shooting, we can pick up target chips off the grass areas of the fields.
- 5. Straighten up the tables and chairs in the Range House.
- 6. Etc.

As a reminder, if you take a TCSA Membership application, whether it is a renewal or a new member, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the Daily Range Fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.
