REGARDLESS of what brings you out to the Range this fall there will be a group of volunteers willing to help you to have a safe and enjoyable day at the Range. The **Range Safety Officers** are eyes and ears at the Range and they are responsible for the safety of all, above all else. If they feel the need to approach you, please heed what they have to say. The weekends of September and October can pretty busy and the probability of having to wait for a bench is higher than any other time of the year! We ask your patience as we work through our occasional backlogs. If you do not need to punch paper, feel free to bring a .22Ir or a handgun and spend time at either of the Plinking Ranges. Any ways to scratch that itchy finger during this busy time!

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

Well, we are back into the unknown as far as holding evaluations for **Online Hunter Education Classes**. We have received the information on protocols we must follow to hold



Classes, but as you may expect this is changing frequently. Because of many contributing factors, it has also been difficult to secure space in the two facilities we use to complete the classroom portion of the evaluations.

The Classes we were hoping to hold on **September 25** and **October 2** are also looking less likely. Our next Class may be a **Traditional Class** starting in **mid-January 2022.**

Students who are age 9 or older can still complete the entire course through the Online Process. Younger students will have to complete the field exercise in person.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up after you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up all brass.

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot, be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.

PRIMITIVE RANGE

The August Shoot was a great day to be at the Range. It was some of the nicest weather we have had in a long time.

Just a note to remind everyone, the Primitive Range is for black powder firearms only. Our targets are not AR plate, they are 3/16-1/4 inch mild steel plate. They work fine for low velocity lead balls. Shooting high velocity jacketed bullets at the Primitive Range is causing damage to the Primitive Range targets. If you need to shoot modern firearms, please use the Rose-Iris or High-Power Ranges. I placed the brass left at the Primitive Range in the Rose-Iris buckets.

Reminder for Primitive Range RSO's, if you cannot stand your assigned duty day, call me so I can arrange for another RSO to stand that duty day. Failure to stand duty days will result in removal from the Primitive Range RSO list.

HIGH-POWER

We are moving into Fall with Smallbore Matches on the 5th, 7th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 21st and 24th; Service Rifle Practice on the 7th, 14th and 21st and the Service Rifle Championship over the 25th and 26th; a 500/ 800 Yard Prone Slow Fire Match on the 18th and 200/300 Yard Prone Slow Fire Match on the 28th; Long Range Practice on the 10th and a Long-Range F-Class Points Series Match on the 11th; and finally, 50 BMG Benchrest Practice and Matches on September 30 and October 1 - 3. Our full 2021 Match Schedule, Match Director contact and Match Programs are posted on our High-Power web page at https://www.tcsahighpower.org/.

RANGE CLOSURES or MATCH REVISIONS: None

The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will remain in place for the 2021 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- If you have been vaccinated you don't need to wear a mask outdoors on the High-Power Range; no verification of vaccination is required.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range remains in good shape, but please use common sense and keep your speed down, particularly on the corners. **Drive only on the graveled areas and avoid any activities that may cause a fire. Report all fires immediately!**



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorse-ment Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It only takes an hour, and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO.
