As most of you are probably aware of by now, the construction of the Benton County Sheriff's Range has started. For the duration of the project, the north side of the Rose-Iris Range including the Centerfire and Rimfire Plinking Ranges will be closed to all shooting from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.

Handling of firearms when the Range is cold and poor muzzle control are some commonly seen violations, so a little extra vigilance will be appreciated by all your fellow shooters.

NEXT AND PROBABLY LAST RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASS FOR THIS YEAR

The next and probably the last TCSA RSO Class for this year is scheduled for **Friday October 14.** This class will start at 8 a.m. at the Shotgun Range House and last until about 3 p.m. Classes are limited in size to 12 participants each and will be filled on a first confirmed basis. The next RSO Classes will be scheduled sometime in late spring 2023.

You will need to be a current 2020-2023 TCSA Member before your name can be added to the RSO Class list. If you are not a current member, either join at the Range or download the TCSA Membership Application form from our website at www.tcsa.info, fill it out and send the Membership form along with your \$50 Individual OR \$75 Spousal check to the address on the form.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like! To become an RSO, you must be a current member, attend the RSO Training Class and obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three times a year. TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it were loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never place or carry a loaded firearm in a motor vehicle.

September already. Time flies while you're having fun, I guess. With the warm weather and the oddly mild winds it really is a good time to come out and shoot some clay targets. With the warehouse full, we have plenty of targets on hand.

2022 5-Stand League, "The Best Damn League at Rattlesnake" has kicked off with a bang! The first day of League featured a good course set by none other than the legendary Phil Volkman. There were some challenging targets, but nothing that was unhittable. Most shooters elected to score (3) rounds and everyone had scores that varied as no one was able to put together consistent results. As you are reading this, the second week of shooting has completed as well. While I was not there, word on the street is that it may have been a slightly stiffer course.

There is still plenty of time to join league and there are plenty of days left to score all (10) rounds required. With the 100 bird sporting clays shoot that is part of League you only need to score (6) rounds for regular League and then you can use your sporting score for the final (4) rounds. That is a tough way to win league though, as you won't be able to replace any of your scores.

League is held on Sunday starting at 9:00 a.m. and will go until we run out of shooters for the day. Regular League rules still apply, cold gun, no kicking and have fun out there! Come out and join the fun, regardless of your ability, you will have a good time!

Rattlesnake was once again well represented at the 2022 Idaho State Shoot which was held at the Rock Creek Sporting Clays facility outside of Emmet, Idaho. per year the Range would have a hard time staying open consistent hours.

Wanting to become one of the cool kid Shotgun RSOs? It's not too hard to do. Look for the next available training class scheduled by the legendary **Mr. Dan Martini** in this very Rattler Newsletter (page 1), take and pass the class, then come get certified at the Shotgun Range. It's that easy to get your very own access card to the Shotgun Range and all the shooting time you could want.

If you are a current Shotgun RSO and find yourself doing one of your duty days on a day with little to no shooters, do not fret, there is always something to do at the Shotgun Range! A couple of things that get overlooked on a regular basis are:

- Make sure all the empty cardboard boxes are removed from the trap and skeet houses.
- 2. Sweep out the trap and skeet houses to remove any target chips or debris.
- 3. Make sure garbage cans are emptied if full.
- 4. If no one is shooting, we can pick up target chips off the grass areas of the fields.
- 5. Straighten up the tables and chairs in the range house.
- Etc.

While we do have a cleaning service that comes out once a month, they only do cleaning inside the range house. All of the items listed above and everything else, is done by your fellow RSOs and volunteers. The more we stay on top of things, the easier it is for all of us.

As a reminder, if you take a TCSA Membership application, whether it is a renewal or a new member, you must provide that person with one of the Temporary Membership Cards found in the RSO briefcase. Be sure they understand that until they get their membership card in the mail, they need to present the temporary card to avoid paying the daily range fee. Membership cards are mailed out promptly, but still may take 3-4 weeks to reach them.

SHOTGUN RSO INFORMATION

Remember current Membership Cards need to be presented <u>every time</u> a shooter signs in if they want to avoid the Daily Range Fee.

We survived another Summer and are ready for the cooler weather in September and October! There are Smallbore Events on the 6th, 8th, 13th,15th, 20th and 23rd; Mid-Range on the 17th and 27th; Service Rifle on the 24th and 25th; and Long Range on the 9th and 10th; and 50 BMG the 29th of September through the 2nd of October. The following COVID adjustments to Match Operations will carry over into our 2022 Match season:

- Social distancing is encouraged and will be maintained to the extent possible.
- Bring exact match fees and your own writing instruments / tablets.
- State and County guidelines will be followed.

E-TARGET USE: Virtually all our High-Power Matches will be run on e-targets this season, so make sure you bring Android tablet or i-Pad with you to the Match (you can also use your cell phone, but its beneficial to have a larger screen). Unfortunately, our current e-targets do not work for smallbore, but we will adopt that technology once it becomes cost effective to do so.

RANGE CONDITIONS: The Range is in good shape, but please use common sense. Keep your speed down, particularly on the corners and only drive on the graveled areas. It is definitely fire season, so behave accordingly.



HIGH-POWER RSO ENDORSEMENT: For any interested TCSA RSO, the 1KYD High Power Endorsement Training is currently being scheduled on an as-needed basis. It takes an hour and allows you unrestricted access to the High-Power Range outside our scheduled Matches. The only prerequisite is that you be a current TCSA RSO.
