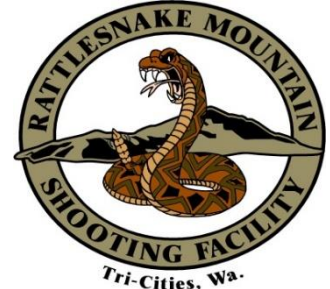

In the past we have seen a number of inexperienced shooters show up and they are sometimes in need of some extra supervision. Handling of firearms when the Range is cold and poor muzzle control are some commonly seen violations, so a little extra vigilance will be appreciated by all your fellow shooters.

**RSOs: Be sure the automatic gate closes behind you when entering or exiting the Rose-Iris Range during off hours. It takes about 30 seconds before the gate will start to close. If you make sure it is closed behind you, we won't have to deal with anyone slipping in, which has happened a few times.**

## VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

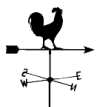

## TCSA FACILITIES

**ROSE-IRIS RANGE** – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

**RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

**CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE** – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

**COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS** – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

**1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE** – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

**HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE:** This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

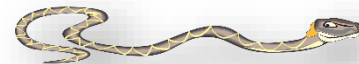

## ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. **Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!**

# OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SHOOTING SPORTS

We held a **Youth Fun Shoot** using .22 rifles on August 24 with 9 shooters participating. The Event was directed toward shooters aged 10 to 18 with some level of prior shooting experience. Course of fire included plinking at paper and steel targets and an Informal Match at 25 yards. Plinking was extremely popular with approximately 1,000 rounds of ammunition expended.

Four shooters fired the Informal Match: 10 shots from the bench and 10 shots offhand. **Izaiah Lane** took top honors with 192-7x. Other contenders were **Eli McNeal** 186-6X, **Mary Hager** 159-6X, **Liam McNeal** 153-1X and **Finn Cooper** 110. **Match Director Hager** awarded **Mr. Lane** two commemorative coins: one from TCSA and a challenge coin from **West Richland Police, Chief Thomas Grego**.

Our shooters deserve acknowledgement for their excellent attention to the safety briefing and range commands and for their overall sportsmanship and good will. The end-of-event drawing for a RMSF cap provides an example of their good will. **Atlee Harvey** had been awarded a National Shooting Sports Foundation cap earlier in the week. Accordingly, he chose to withdraw from the drawing and turned in his ticket. Naturally, his ticket stub was the first one drawn. **Atlee** stood by his decision and demonstrated the good character which we hope our events can help to foster. **Townes Cooper** won the hat on the redraw and he elected to gift it to his younger brother, **Finn**. All our participants are Good Kids.

Our post-shooting debriefings with parents and with shooters indicated satisfaction with the Event. Notable comments included, "**MORE!**", "**Handguns and shotguns too!**" and "**Can we get a sponsor and start awarding match winners guns as well as coins?**"

Thanks to **Ron Jorgensen, George Hager, Will McNeal, Bob Veatch** and **Frank Cooper** for planning and executing the Event. Their contributions as well as those of the parents who brought their kids to the Event are important steppingstones in the development of youth shooting sports programs within TCSA. And thanks to **Chief Grego** for his ongoing community-wide support of safety training for youth in the shooting sports.

# SHOTGUN REPORT

We are now approximately 75% of the way through 2024. Have you shot as many times as you would like to by now? If not, now is the time to come out and put some rounds through your trusty shotgun. Trap, Skeet and 5-Stand are open and we are accepting new shooters every day.

The **Rattlesnake Non-League Trap League** has now been going strong since October 2023. We have taken a week or two off occasionally, but for the most part it's been held every Sunday in one way or another. But that is all coming to an end with a new and improved (?) **Rattlesnake Non-League Trap League 2.0!** I know, if it is not broke don't fix it, but that is just not how we roll. Actually, everyone is starting to stack up on the 27-yard line, so we needed to try something.

Moving forward we will be holding a monthly shoot in lieu of the weekly Sunday shoots. **The first Sunday of each month we will be holding a 100 Bird Trap Shoot.** That's right kids, you need to bring more ammo with you. We will be shooting (25) birds from the 16-yard line, (25) birds from your handicap distance and then a full round of trap doubles! We have run a couple preliminary shoots, mainly because we always shoot on Sundays, but it works and really takes about the same amount of time.

With the change in format, we have also changed the entry fee and lewis classes. With the 100 Bird format it will be \$10 to join, but we will now have two lewis classes. First class will be for High Overall and Runner Up, and then the second class will be the middle of the class. More chances to miss birds, but there are also more chances to be the top shooter.

As with the **Non-League League 1.0**, if you do not have an established handicap for **Non-League League 2.0**, you will start on the 20-yard line. Also, the **50 Straight Pot**, currently at \$270 will still be in play. Run both your 16-yard line and Handicap round to take home the money. Or impress your friends and run Doubles to take home the prize. Your choice.

While we call it a Trap League, it is really just a group of shooters getting together to shoot clay targets. Not a "Trap" shooter? Well, most of aren't which is evident by our scores. Or, maybe you are a Trapshooter, well then come out and join us. No matter what it is called, we usually have a good time.

One other change is that we will be moving the **Non-League League 2.0** to **Trap Field 1**. With moving the trap between singles and doubles, it works better on the upper trap.

# HIGH-POWER

With September upon us, it is the time of year to think about hunter sight in. If you haven't been to the High-Power Range since last September, I will remind the High-Power RSOs to put the bravo (red) flag up by the highway gate on your way in, sign in at the west end pit conex and pay your day use fee there too. As a reminder, all shooters on the Range must shoot from the same yard line (obvious but a good reminder none the less). It is still fire season so stay on those gravel roads and follow the ammo rules.

September is a busy one this year. On the centerfire side we have got our final 200 yard reduced across the course High-Power Match on August 31, the **Washington State Service Rifle Championship** and a **CMP EIC Match September 21 and 22**, and a **50 BMG Match September 27 - 29**. On the smallbore side of things we've got a **50/100 Yard Dewar Match** on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, a **Vintage Smallbore** on the 5<sup>th</sup>, **100/200 Yard Smallbore** on the 8<sup>th</sup>, **50 Yard UBR** on the 10<sup>th</sup>, **50 Yard ARA** on the 12<sup>th</sup>, **ELR Smallbore** on the 7<sup>th</sup>, **PR22 Match** (at HESA) on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and a **100 Yard Mini-Palma** on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Note **Smallbore start times are back to the spring/fall times.**

August was pretty smallbore heavy, starting off with a **Dewar Match** on the 6<sup>th</sup>. It started off with clear warm weather, with a slight steady breeze, but conditions became more challenging as the morning progressed, with the day heating up toward the upper 80's and the winds becoming fickle, 8-10 MPH and swirling. **David Vance** was the only shooter to clean any target and won honors for the high card with 200-15X at 50yards. **John Julian** shot 99% overall and won the 1 Match with the high aggregate score of 396-24X.

At the August 8<sup>th</sup> **Vintage Smallbore**, in spite of sporty winds, 8-12 MPH swirling, the Match was well attended. We were happy to welcome **Tom Halecki** back to the Range, as well as **Steve Gaudteault** who accompanied him. **Mike Bunch** brought his grandson, **Jackson Farmer** who came in one place behind Mike (Only because Mike made him use a scope and accept the 3 point per card penalty). **Glen Buxton** and **Mike Bunch** tied numerically for the top score, with the match winner determined by the earliest X. Congratulations to Glen who continues his domination of this series and also won the high card honors today. Several shooters scored clean raw card scores: **Jackson Farmer**, **Tom Halecki**, **Ron Jorgenson** and **Steve Gaudteault** all cleaned both targets, while **Glen Buxton** and **Larry Meerdink** each cleaned their first card. Superb shooting in challenging conditions Gents!

At the August 13<sup>th</sup> **USBR Match** the temperature at RMSF was pleasant enough at 65°F, but the 12-16 MPH winds definitely depressed scores on the "Green Monster".

Thankfully, the wind direction was fairly consistent throughout both cards. **Tom Walchuk** was the day's "Top Gun" leading all shooters with the best card of 240-6X, and the Match winning a, leading score of 469-10X. Way to go Tom!

Finally, the 50 Yard ARA Match on August 15 was contested by 6 shooters. The RMSF blessed us with an unseasonably comfortable 72°F. However, the Rattlesnake winds took their toll. Winds were swirling across the course, challenging shooters with values that ranged from dead calm to 8 MPH. At least one gust pegged 12 MPH. Ben Cook had a splendid recovery on his second card, besting all shooters with both the High Card of 2225-15X, and the Match winning High Aggregate of 3950-23X. Great shooting Ben!
