NEXT RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASS

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

SMALLBORE COMPETITION RANGE - A 100 Yard Range with 20 firing points. The SCR is designed for optimum support of and exclusively for .22LR (smallbore) Competition Events. The Range is only to be used for Smallbore Events scheduled and supervised by a TCSA trained Match Director. No casual use or individual practice is allowed. Future plans include covered firing points and shooting benches.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

This may be our last class of the calendar year. I had to cancel the class we had scheduled for September 6 because a number of instructors were unavailable.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign-in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and unload firearms when they are not in use.

TIDBITS: USPSA RULES - concerning the 'external safety'.

DQ offenses for not having the <u>Safety</u> on while in the holster or placed on an object. **SAFETY FIRST**, people!!!

10.5.11 Holstering or placing a loaded firearm, in any of the following conditions:

10.5.11.1 A single action self-loading firearm with the safety not applied. If the primary safety on the firearm cannot be engaged due to the design of the firearm and the hammer or trigger cannot be actuated in the condition the gun is in, the safety does not have to be applied. If the gun is completely empty, the safety need not be applied.

10.5.11.2 A double action or selective action pistol with the hammer cocked and the safety not applied.

10.5.11.3 A revolver with the hammer cocked.

All these conditions apply the entire time the firearm is in the holster or placed on an object as required by the Written Stage Briefing. See 8.1.2.5.

It has been a busy summer, besides being hot and for the last week somehow humid? We don't have humidity here, but this week it's felt like Camp Perry!

For those who need to get your volunteer credit for this year, we are having a **weed removal day September 13**. We have quite a crop of weeds on all the firing berms, that are now dead since the spraying that happened last month, but are still in the way, and ugly to boot. Contact **Mike Sowa** at the email below to volunteer.

Upcoming Matches for September include on the Smallbore side include a 22 Rimfire Steel Match on September 6, a PR 22 Match September 7, 50/100 Yard Dewar September 9, Vintage Smallbore September 11, 100/200 Yard Smallbore September 14, 50 Yard USBR Smallbore September 16, 50 Yard ARA Smallbore September 18, Youth Smallbore September 28 and 100 Yard Mini-Palma September 30.

On the Centerfire side of thigs we've got the Washington State Service Rifle Championship September 20, a CMP EIC Service Rifle Match September 21 and 50 BMG 1000 Yard September 26 - 28.

Looking back at recent Matches, at the July 29 **Youth Smallbore**, we had an early breeze which may have had some impact on scores, but everyone shot over 190. We continued with the option of shooting for record at either 25 or 50 yards. The **Henderson** sisters won both events with **Payten** shooting 196-3X at 50 and **Allyxis** 197-14X at 25.

The July 29 **Mini-Palma** was a bit challenging with an inconsistent wind. The Match winner was **Tom Walchuk** with a clean 450-27x. Tom was followed closely by **Glen Clifford** with a 447 and **Mike Bunch** with a 446.

At the August 5 **Dewar Match**, we started off with a gentle breeze and a minute later the wind came up. Not much in speed but it kept changing directions every few shots. **Ben Cook** was the Match winner (398-29x) and **Tom Walchuk** was second (397-25x). Tom shot the only clean card of the Match. **Glen Clifford** was close behind for third (395-22x).

At the August 7 **Vintage Smallbore Match**, we had a slight wind, but with no handicap for scoped rifles, scores were great. **Glen Clifford** was Match winner with a 400-34Xx. Second was **Tom Halecki** with a 400-33x and third was **Tom Walchuk** with a 400-27x (with iron sights!).

At the August 9 **Youth Smallbore**, a new shooter (**Drazen Brown**) shot remarkably well for a new shooter with a loaner rifle, scoring 171 3X at 25 yards. Wind was essentially nonexistent and it stayed pleasantly cool until the Match was over. **Mack Mactanagay** won at 25 yards
