TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 and 1000 yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400 yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500 yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

ADVANTAGES TO BEING A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public – YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a RSO, you must attend the RSO Training Class, obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three to four times a year and keep your membership current.

RANGE SAFETY OFFICER TRAINING CLASS

The next TCSA RSO Training Class is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 15 at the Richland Public Library. If you want to become a TCSA Range Safety Officer sign up for this Class. To get your name on the Class list, send me an e-mail message to dantini@charter.net. You must be a TCSA Member to attend this Class. If you are not currently a member, you may join the TCSA that evening by arriving at 5 p.m. so we can sign you up before the class, as there is no time available during the class for enrollment.

After completion of this classroom session, you will be required to attend one of the two 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. Practical Days on Friday May 24 or Friday May 31 at the Shotgun Range House. If you cannot obligate yourself to complete one of the two scheduled Practical Days and to volunteer for three Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, or Sunday duty days in the upcoming year, this Class is not for you.

This Class is for new RSO candidates who are at least 21 years of age and also for current TCSA ROs who stand RSO duties at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range and want to upgrade their training to get all the new information. This Class is limited to 30 participants and will be filled on a first confirmed basis. This RSO Training Class is intended for those persons who are willing to obligate themselves to open and operate the Rose-Iris Range for the public and general TCSA membership on three Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sundays throughout the year. Range Safety Officers are required to schedule their own Rose-Iris Range duty days.

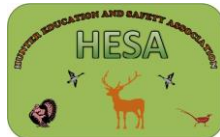

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, and keep your finger off of the trigger until you are ready to shoot.

YOUTH INTRODUCTION TO FIREARMS

YOUTH INTRODUCTION TO FIREARMS returns in 2019.

The TCSA will be conducting a series of classes designed to introduce youth to firearms, firearms safety and shooting. Participants will be introduced to shooting with activities, targets and competition suitable for junior shooters.

This Event will offer an opportunity to learn gun safety, practice gun safety and learn about gun handling and shooting techniques. Each participant will be assisted by a qualified TCSA RSO. The first Class will be held on **May 25**.

Other Classes will be held on **June 29, August 24** and **September 28**. Each Class will stress gun safety and will finish with an opportunity for the participants to apply their new skill in a fun and relevant shooting competition.

The Event is open to all youths aged 8 through 17 (girls and boys). This is an entry level event intended for youths with little or no shooting experience. All participants must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Participants should plan on arriving by 9:30 a.m. for registration.

Activities will begin at 10:00 a.m. and last about two hours. Activities will be held at the **Hunter Education Safety Range** located adjacent to the Rose-Iris Public Range.

Participants must preregister for each Class they plan on attending. Each event is limited to 10 participants and is first come first served. Preregister by sending an email to rjorge@charter.net. Be sure to include name(s) and age(s). There is no charge for these Classes.

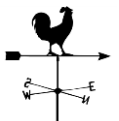

HIGH-POWER

RANGE CONDITIONS AND SCHEDULE: The Canyon road is clear of snow drifts but remains very soft as the run off from the slopes of Rattlesnake Mountain continue to filter down to the Yakima River. **We need to stay off the road for a couple more weeks** to give the graveled areas a chance to tighten up before we hit them with significant traffic. Accordingly, we are going to keep **High Power proper closed through Thursday, April 11**.

Our first Match of the season is the **Mid and Long Range Match** scheduled for the weekend of **April 12 - 14**. Following that we have **Smallbore Matches** scheduled for **April 13 and 17 and May 1, 3, 8 and 11**; **Service Rifle Practices** on **April 16, 23 and 30** and **Matches** on **April 20 and May 4 and 5**; **50 BMG** on **April 25 - 28**; **Mid Range Prone Practice** on **April 18** and **Matches** on **April 23 and May 10**; and **Long Range Practice** on **April 25 and May 2 and 9** and **Matches** **May 17 - 19**. High Power's 2019 schedule is complete and is posted on the High Power discipline page.

RANGE CLOSURES AND MATCH CANCELLATIONS: The Range will remain closed to shooting and general access through April 11. This closure DOES NOT pertain to the **work party** scheduled for **April 5 - 7** or target prep leading up to the MR/LR Match, but the expectation is that we keep traffic limited to just those endeavors. Access for both match and non-match use will resume on April 12.

WORK PARTY: We have a Work Party scheduled for the weekend of **April 5 - 7** to install the new electronic target bases. This is a labor intensive endeavor, and we

can use all the help we can get. Please contact **John Hauptmann** if you are available.

CANYON GATE COMBINATION CHANGE: We have changed the combo on the Canyon gate. As a **TCSA High Power RSO** you will be provided the new combo when you sign up for your **2019 High Power Duty Day**. Contact **John Hauptmann** to schedule your Duty Day. Life Members with High Power Endorsements are exempt from the duty day requirement, but you still have to contact John for the new combo.

WEEKNIGHT SERVICE RIFLE AND LONG RANGE PRACTICE OPPORTUNITIES: Beginning the third week of April we will be having discipline specific practice sessions on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. **Dave Baalman** is running the **Service Rifle Practice** every **Tuesday** beginning **April 16** and **John Hauptmann** is running the **Long Range Practices** every **Thursday** beginning **April 18**. The new USPSA Rules are in affect. There are some changes, so read the rules and make sure you are in compliance with your Division. The [USPSA Rules](#) can be downloaded to you phone for easy access or get the [USPSA App](#) for your phone. USPSA is no longer printing rulebooks.

RULE 5.2.7.2 still applies across all Divisions - the heel of the butt of the handgun must be even with or higher than the top of the belt. Single Stack Division rules were changed to be consistent with this requirement.

LOCAL NEWS: EWPSA will be hosting the **2019 Inland Empire Sectional** on **May 18 - 19**. Registration opened on January 1 in [Practiscore](#). The Match filled in less than a week. If you want to shoot, I can use locals for Staff.

Ha! A couple of firsts are out of the way for the year: I got to shoot *without* having to shovel snow first. I got to shoot with *less than 3* layers of clothing on, and I got to shoot with all around great guy **Lindsay Nelsen**! Sometimes the little things in life make all the difference. Even though we are still experiencing weather a little too chilly for shorts, it is still a darn sight better than the snow apocalypse of February! Come on out and shoot, the weather's fine!

Not often am I wrong, and if I am, I block it from my memory. So, this is the one and only correction you will ever read in the Shotgun Report, that I remember. The **Sub-Gauge Shoot** is going to be held on **April 20th** with **sign up at 8:00 a.m.** and **shooting begins at 9:00 a.m.** sharp. The previous Newsletter I had the wrong date.

This is going to be a fun shoot! Pick the sub-gauge you are going to shoot for the day, shoot all 4 events, add in a handicap if you are shooting 28ga or .410 ga, and then collect your SILVER for winning via Lewis class scoring! 2 years ago, **Chris Quinton** won the whole enchilada shooting .410ga and taking advantage of the extra (12) birds he got via the handicap system. Who's going to knock Quinton off his pedestal? **The events consist of (25) rounds each of 16 yard trap, 10 yard continental, 5-Stand and Skeet.** Total of 100 rounds!

Ah yes Skeet. That game we all know and love? Skeet is a cruel mistress, just when you are kicking it in your lazyboy chair with slippers on thinking life is good, she goes all bat-poo crazy and you're left wondering what the heck just happened, and where's my chicken pot pie!
