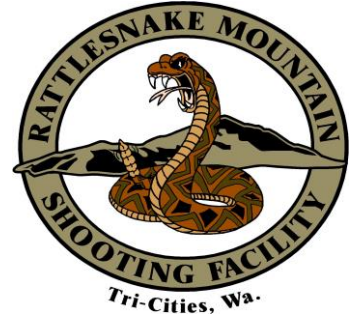

ROSE-IRIS RSOs SCHEDULING CALENDAR

Duty Day Calendar
MAY 1 2019 through APRIL 30 2020

- RSOs must sign up for their **THREE** duty days by **JUNE 30**. **ALL THREE** duty days need to be scheduled by **JUNE 30** or your Access Key Card will be deactivated; you will then have until **JULY 31**. **After JULY 31 you will lose your RSO privileges.**

- RSOs are required to find their own duty swaps - it is your responsibility to stand your assigned duty.

- RSOs who swap dates should notify **Mike Ensminger**, Chief RSO - chiefrso@tcsa.info and **Greg Spencer**, RSO Scheduler - rsoscheduler@tcsa.info, as well as their swap partner by email; please include your TCSA number.

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 and 1000 yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400 yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500 yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

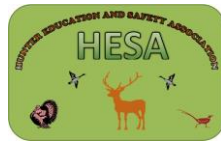

Registration for that Class opens on April 23 through **Richland Parks and Public Facilities**, either online or in person. Class will be held on Monday and Thursday evenings from **June 10 – 27**, with Range Day on Saturday morning **June 22**.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to **sign in at the Rose-Iris Range** before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. **You are also expected to clean up after you are done shooting, including all brass.**

Always remember to control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it and keep your finger off of the trigger until you are ready to shoot.

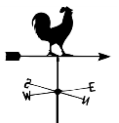

Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a RSO, you must attend the RSO Training Class, obligate yourself to volunteer at the Range three to four times a year and keep your membership current.

RANGE SAFETY OFFICER TRAINING CLASS

The next and probably the last TCSA RSO Training Class for this year is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 15 at the Richland Public Library. If you want to become a TCSA Range Safety Officer sign up for this class. To get your name on the Class list, send me an e-mail message to dantini@charter.net. You must be a TCSA Member to attend this Class. If you are not currently a member, you may join the TCSA that evening by arriving at 5 p.m. so we can sign you up before the class, as there is no time available during the class for enrollment.

After completion of this classroom session, you will be required to attend one of the two 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. Practical Days on Friday May 24 or Friday May 31 at the Shotgun Range House. If you cannot obligate yourself to complete one of the two scheduled Practical Days and to volunteer for three Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, or Sunday duty days in the upcoming year, this Class is not for you.

This Class is for new RSO candidates who are at least 21 years of age and also for current TCSA ROs who stand RSO duties at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range and want to upgrade their training to get all the new information. This Class is limited to 30 participants and will be filled on a first confirmed basis. This RSO Training Class is intended for those persons who are willing to obligate themselves to open and operate the Rose-Iris Range for the public and general TCSA membership on three Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sundays throughout the year. Range Safety Officers are required to schedule their own Rose-Iris Range duty days.

The [USPSA Rules](#) can be downloaded to you phone for easy access, or get the [USPSA App](#) for your phone. EWPSA printed off USPSA Rules booklets, because the internet/WiFi does not always work at some of the remote Ranges. If you want one for your range bag, the cost is \$16. Ask a EWPSA Board Member for assistance.

HIGH-POWER

After an exceptionally long winter, High Power is finally open for business. We have **Smallbore Matches** scheduled for **May 1, 3, 4, 8, 15, 18 and 31** and **June 1; Service Rifle Practices** on **May 7, 14, 21 and 28** and **Matches** on **May 11 and 12; 50 BMG** on **May 23 – 26; Mid Range Prone Matches** on **May 10 and 21; Long Range Practice** on **May 2 and 9** and **Matches** on **May 17 - 19**; and a **Vintage Military Rifle Match** on **May 5**. High Power's 2019 schedule has been updated and is posted on the High Power discipline page.

RANGE CLOSURES AND MATCH CANCELLATIONS:
None

SENIOR 200/300 MATCH: The first Senior 200/300 Match of 2019 was held on April 23. The range conditions were mild with very little wind for the 1st relay. The second relay was not quite as lucky. A late Spring start but the weather was not too bad. Thanks to everyone for helping in the pits. Ben and John tied numerically for 1st with Ben having the high X count. Ben Cook was Match Winner with a score of 198-13X (99%.) John Schneider was second with 198-11X (99%.) Dave McCauley placed 3rd with 195-5X (97.5%.) Congratulations! Thanks to Ben Cook for helping run the Match.

100 YARD SMALLBORE (22LR) SLOW FIRE MATCH: The first April 17 100 yard Smallbore (22LR) Slow Fire Match was attended by five competitors. It was a cold day with unwelcome, nasty, treacherous wind conditions. Rattlesnake Mountain once again demonstrated its perversity by providing a "Spring Wind Torture" event. Despite the horrible conditions, John demonstrated his superior wind reading skills and triumphed. 1st place was taken by **John Schneider** with 433-22X (96.22%.) Second place was **Gary Meerdink** with 423-14X (94%.) Thanks to **Tex Long** for running the shooting line.

MARCH MID-RANGE MATCH: Conditions during Friday's Mid-Range Match were relatively mild for April at Rattlesnake. But the winds were fickle enough to keep anyone from shooting a perfect score, though a few folks came really close, including **Dan Steinmetz** who only dropped three points at 300 yards in Black Powder Target Rifle, and **James Patterson** who only dropped 1 point at 300 yards and 2 more at 600 in the Palma category. F-Class shooters had a bit more trouble. **Don Purdy** was the top scoring F-Open shooter, while **Tab Severns** took the top spot in F-TR as well as the combined F-Class trophy.

MARCH PALMA MATCH: For Saturday's Palma course we were under constant threat of rain. The BPTR shooters wisely opted to stay home and keep their powder dry; but nine stalwart smokeless shooters took the field and managed to do some pretty impressive shooting despite poor light and a flickering tailwind. Three shooters managed to only drop one point at 800 yards; **John Van Santford** in F-TR, and **Keith Glasscock** and **David Christian** in F-Open. Things got tougher at 900 yards and nobody did quite as well, except **Mike Sowa** who ended the day leading in F-TR by X-count alone. **Keith Glasscock** only gave up two points at 900 to take a slim lead over challenger **David Christian**. We were just about ready for the first relay at 1000 yards when the weather finally broke and by consensus we called it a day before anyone got too wet.

MARCH LONG-RANGE MATCH: Sunday morning dawned biting cold and blustery with 20 mph gusts veering from 7:00 to 9:00 and back again. Without any visible mirage, shooters had to try to make sense of the flags that made no sense at all. In BPTR, **Dan Steinmetz** resumed his winning streak, taking both stages and the overall 1000-yard prize for that category. **John Van Santford** finally caught a gear to dominate at 1000 yards, giving him the Long-Range trophy in the F-TR category. And F-Open was another knife fight between **Keith Glasscock** and **David Christian**. This time Keith only managed to get a one-point edge, but that added to his two-point lead from Saturday gave him the Long-Range trophy for F-Open class. Congratulations to this weekend's winners, and thanks to everyone who came out to shoot.

22LR BENCHREST MATCH: The April 10 50 Yard 22LR Match (held at the HESA Range) was attended by five senior competitors. It was cold and a nasty wind bedeviled the shooters. 1st place was taken by **Ben Cook** with 229-1X (91.6%.) Following closely in 2nd place was **John Schneider** with 227-2X (90.8%.) Thanks to **Tex Long** for running the Match and the shooting line and helping with the score keeping.

22 LR DEWAR MATCH: The April 3 50/100 Yard 22LR Match (Dewar) was attended by five competitors.
